### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 2 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of John F. Mulcahy, Jr., and others to lay out Greason Road, from Worcester Road southerly approximately 900', as and for a public way. Four residents appeared in favor, and no one appeared in opposition to it. Town Engineer Dyer stated it would cost approximately \$5,000. and would pay for itself within five years. The Board voted to recommend the street for acceptance.

\*February 8, 1949\*

A public hearing was held at 2:10 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of Thelma F. Joyce and others to lay out Thelma Road, from Concord Street to Duffett Road, as and for a public way. Four persons appeared in favor and no one appeared in opposition to it. The Town Engineer stated it would cost approximately \$3700. to build and had never been approved by the Board of Survey. It was voted to recommend the street for acceptance provided the same was approved by the Board of Survey before the March Town Meeting.

A public hearing was held at 2:15 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of Bertram L. Whittemore and others to lay out Sturgis Road, from Concord Street to Richwood Street, as and for a public way. Bertram L. Whittemore and J. Carey Hennebry appeared in favor of this petition. No one was present in opposition to it. The Town Engineer stated that only one, a Mr. Dagg, had not signed off. The Board voted to recommend the street for acceptance as far as the last house.

A public hearing was held at 2:25 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of Fabian K. Werkowski and others to lay out Ransom Road, from Winter Street to Pincushion Road, as and for a public way. Sebastiano Guagenty and four others appeared in favor. The Town Engineer stated it would cost \$5,000. or \$6,000., and the present valuation of \$14,300. does not come within the formula which will pay for this street in five years. The Board voted not to recommend the street at this time.

### \*HEARINGS SCHEDULED\*

A public hearing will be held on February 23, at 2 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. for three poles, guy wire and anchor to the third pole on Mt. Wayte Avenue, southwesterly from a point approximately 285' southwest of the N.Y. N.H. & H. R.R.; four poles on Mt. Wayte Ave., northeasterly from the N.Y. N.H. & H. R.R.

Co. for three poles, guy wire and anchor to the third pole on Audubon Road, southeasterly from a point approximately 135' southeast of Concord Street.

Action taken informally in granting a permit to the following was ratified:


Obstruct sidewalk - Pittsburgh Plate Glass Co., 26 Concord Street, replacing glass in store front, February 4.
