### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 2:15 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for two poles, guy wire and anchor to each pole on Beaver St., southerly from a point approximately 105' south of Waverly St., (three existing jointly owned poles to be removed). Grace Sullivan appeared requesting information, but did not object to the granting of this petition. No opposition was expressed and the Board voted to grant the same.

### \*ELKS PROPERTY\*

It was voted to reject all bids for the sale of the house formerly known as the Elks Home. 7

### \*HEARING SCHEDULED\*

A public hearing will be held on March 15, at 2 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Gerald B. Liscombe and Ronald H. Wood for a license to operate motor vehicles for the carriage of passengers for hire over the following route in Framingham:

From the Natick town line over Cochituate Road to Concord Street; thence over Concord Street to Howard Street; thence over Howard Street to Freeman Street; thence over Freeman Street to Frederick Street; thence over Frederick Street to Concord Street, and returning to the Natick town line via Concord Street and Cochituate Road.

The proposed route in the Town of Framingham constitutes a portion of a planned route connecting Cochituate and Framingham.

### \*CONFERENCE\*

A conference was held with Captain Rafferty of the Boston & Albany R.R. Police, Vincent Curran and Mr. Nash of the Boston & Albany R.R., and Chief of Police Edward T. McCarthy regarding the installation of automatic gates on the Concord Street crossing. The matter was taken under consideration.


