### \*PETITIONS\*

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for removal of one pole on Concord St., approximately 30' northeast of Gibbs St., and one pole location on Concord St., approximately 95' northeast of Gibbs St., was granted.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Edmands Rd., southerly side, approximately 255' west of Wayside Inn Road, was granted.

### \*CONFERENCE\*

A conference was held with Homer Dodge, Bertram Whittemore and John Paul regarding the action to be taken by the town on articles 50, 51 and 52. The matter was discussed, and the Finance Committee will make proper motions on these articles.

### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 2 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for permission to lay and maintain underground conduits and manholes, with the wires and cables to be placed therein, under the surface of the following public way or ways:

Cochituate Rd., 114' underground conduit between MH 278D on Concord St. and pole 20; Concord St. 1299 feet of underground conduit between pole 94 and MH 278A; Concord St., one MH at Cochituate Rd., no. 278D, Concord St., one MH 155 feet south of Landseer Ave., no. 278C. No one appeared in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing on the application of Demetre J. Petro for an All Alcoholic Beverage Seasonal License as a Common Victualer, at 132 Kendall St., opened at 2:23 P.M. and adjourned to the Veterans' Meeting Room. Attorney J. Walton Tuttle represented the petitioner, and stated that they would serve

meals as well as liquor and the place would seat from 50 to 60 persons. He stated that the applicant had conducted this business for a number of years, and that the location applied for was in a business zone. He stated further that there were only two abutters, but that many others had been notified of the application. No one else appeared in favor of the granting of this license. Attorney Morris Shapiro, speaking in opposition, stated that there were several three decker houses in the immediate vicinity, and that the lots upon which most of the houses were located were 50 or 60 feet in width. He said that every one had children, and that many children residing in a tenement house had no place to play other than in the street. He stated that one liquor license on Kendall St. was adequate to serve this neighborhood, and that the granting of another license in this locality would create an added hazard, and requested the Board not to grant this license. The Chairman of the Board stated that a petition had been filed with the Board signed by eighty-eight people in opposition to granting this license. William M. Devine, Geo. L. Carr, Mrs. Richardson, Mrs. Austin Frossel, Charles Harper, Mrs. Helen Murphy and William A. Thorpe were also recorded as opposed to granting this license. The Board unanimously voted to deny this license.
