### \*CONFERENCES\*

The Chairman of the Selectmen explained that valuations should be reviewed where high rents are charged, and that in matters in the Assessor's office the Board wishes to have letters signed by the three members where the responsibility is placed on all the other members.

A conference was held regarding the layout of Curve Street with Anthony Colonna, Chairman of the Board of Public Works. He stated that the Board of Public Works had intended to spend some money there, but when the petition was presented to the Selectmen to relocate this street his Board waited to see what action this Board would take. He also stated that the Board of Public Works would go over the matter and put the street in a good condition.

A conference was held with Fire Private James R. Burns regarding his record of absence from duty. Fire Chief Leroy Trevett was also present. Private Burns stated that whenever he has been absent it has been for a legitimate reason and that he would try in the future to condense his absence from duty to as little time as possible.

A conference was held with the following members of the Kiwanis Club of Framingham: President Frederick Briscoe, Stuart Potter, Lee Berry, Dom Femia, Franklin McCormick, and B. L. Whittemore. This conference was for the purpose of discussing the by-law accepted at the annual town meeting which makes registration of bicycles necessary. The entire question was discussed and it was decided to notify the Kiwanis Club of Framingham that when the plates and other equipment are furnished the Board, plans will be made to proceed with the registration.
