A public hearing was held at 2:08 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of J. R. Macomber for a license to use the land at 450 Salem End Road, for the storage of 500 gallons of gasoline, in one underground tank, for private use. Attorney Julian T. Hargraves and W. A. Hatch, representing the applicant, were present in favor. No one was present in opposition to it. It was voted to grant the same.
