CONFERENCES

A conference was held with Chief of Police Edward T. McCarthy, Captain Frank B. Donnelly, Mr. Stapleton representing Fitts Bros. Real Estate Office, Agatha Kwasek and Attorney A. G. Mainini, her counsel. The record of the applicant and condition of the premises were discussed, and as there has been an improvement the Board voted to grant her a license to conduct a Lodging House at 18 Kendall Street under the following conditions: No lodgers on the third floor; not over seven rooms to be rented to lodgers; no liquor to be drunk on the premises.

A conference was held with the owner of Charles W. Laing Woodworking Corp., 47 Mellen St., on complaint of Mrs. Dondero about the noise from a blower on the above premises, and certain amount of mist in the air. Mr. Laing stated that there are no fumes going more than 15' away from the building. Mr. Laing in answer to a question, stated that he cannot change the schedule because it is necessary to take one step after the other because the work cannot be rushed. He said he would contact state authorities to see if something could be done on the matter.


