### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 2:30 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of George Mason and others to lay out Swift Road, from end of present accepted way to end of street, as and for a public way. Town Engineer Dyer was present. Joseph J. Piazza, an abutter, was present in favor. William J. Keane was present as an interested party but not an abutter. The Board voted to take the matter under advisement for the present.

A public hearing was held at 3 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Samuel Cohen for a Class III Motor Vehicle License at the rear of 4 Waverly Street. Mr. Cohen and Mrs. Anthony L. Ghetti were present. Mrs. Ghetti stated that a man from the Natick Auto Parts had leased the property in question and is operating this business. Mr. Cohen stated that he had no trouble in Westboro or any place else where he, Cohen, had operated. The Board felt that Mr. Cohen wanted to get a license for the Natick man in his, Cohen's name, as this man was denied a license by the Board of Selectmen to operate in Natick. Mr. Cohen was advised that when the Natick man gets out of his place then he, Cohen, will be granted a license by the Selectmen.


