FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Lieutenant stated he sent him home and called the Chief. The Chief said to be here this afternoon.

Private Carr stated that he went to work last night at 6 o'clock and stated that Lt. Sheehy said he was unfit for duty and to go home. Private Carr stated that he went down to the Dr. and submitted his medical certificate to the Board.

Mr. Randall asked Lt. Sheehy if he could smell liquor on him to which the Lt. replied "no, sir, I know booze when I see it".

Chief Trevett stated that you have a man with an attitude he has got and that he firmly believes this man has had enough chances. The Fire Chief stated further that he expects Private Carr to understand that if there is any re-occurrence of these circumstances, he will notify the Civil Service and the Chief will also recommend dismissal. The Fire Chief stated that this man has been told previously and he has the same attitude, and the Chief also stated that he wants the man to understand that he has got to do his work.


Mr. Galvani stated that the case has been discussed. There are two phases to this thing. In other words, he stated that he has always been willing to go along the first time, but the next time there will be no suspension and further advised Private Carr that the Chief will ask for his dismissal from the force. From now on he told him that he is on his own. The next time the Chief will ask for actual dismissal and we, as a Board, will have to back him up on it.

Private Carr stated that he thought the Board would find the Chief was wrong.

Mr. Randall told Private Carr that the Board is giving him a break today, but don't want to see him in here again.
