RAILROAD CROSSING MATTER

In spite of previous hearing before the Department of Public Utilities at which time the Board of Selectmen, the Town Counsel and the Chief of Police were present and protested taking a man off the Concord Street crossing, the Public Utilities will remove a man not later than February 1, 1950. The Selectmen feel that it is a deplorable situation and the worst place in Mass. Chief McCarthy stated he would have Patrolman Berte count the number of trains. The Selectmen voted to have the Town Counsel take necessary steps to correct this situation.

CONFERENCE

A conference was held with the Boys' and Girls' Committee of the Kiwanis Club for the purpose of discussing bicycle registrations. Chief of Police McCarthy was also present. Mr. Whittemore of the Kiwanis Club stated that there was a bill in the name of the town between \$500. and \$600. It was agreed to hold off paying for the plates until the next special town meeting if by then we have the money through for registrations. Mr. Whittemore stated that the plates will be handled through the schools starting with the Hastings School. Mr. Galvani stated that the Chief will give the Committee one or two men which would assist the committee and be present and assist said committee when the registration takes place, and that five or six of the Kiwanis Club will have to pass on the bikes. Chief McCarthy stated that the registration of bikes is a matter of protection to the bike owner and the mother and father. It was agreed that it will be necessary to have a reflector - 2" in diameter - cost of which will be


