A public hearing was held at 4:30 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Trustees of Middlesex Trust for a license to use the land at 1 Worcester Rd. for the storage of 20,000 gallons of fuel oil, in two underground tanks, for private use. 
