CONFERENCES

William E. Clinton, Treasurer and Manager of the Towne House Inc. of Framingham, 22-28 South St., and his Attorney, Curtis B. Dooling, conferred with the Board. Mr. Clinton was requested to be present to show cause, if any he had, as to why his license should not be suspended and/or revoked, as it has come to the attention of this Board that he is not conducting his business in a proper manner. The Chairman of the Board explained that he was called in because of complaints of Chief McCarthy such as sales to minors and girls and women with bad reputations, who were frequent visitors to the Towne House. Attorney Dooling represented Mr. Clinton and stated he was willing to go along with the Board with any suggestions that they had, and he was advised not to sell to minors and to keep undesirable women and girls out of the place of business, and not to sell too much to anyone.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 4:40 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Axton-Cross Corp. of Mass. for a license to use the land at the rear of 551 Waverly St. for the storage of 40,000 gallons of Sulphuric, Muriatic, Nitric and Acetic Acids in four aboveground tanks. Albert C. Doyle, Esq., attorney for the applicant, appeared in favor of the granting of this license. Messrs. Garber and Galvin also spoke in favor. Chief Trevett questioned the applicant regarding the different kinds of acid to be stored, and it was stated by the applicant that none of the acids are inflammable. Mr. Garber stated that the principal part of the business is to distribute acids in small quantities and that approximately one-half the storage requested would be used at this time. The matter was taken under advisement.

A public hearing was had at 5 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. for a location for conduits and manholes on Worcester Road, at the Framingham-Natick Line, a distance of approximately 20 feet. No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 5:05 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Saxony Road, approximately 60' west of Saxony Terrace. No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.


