CONFERENCES

A conference was held with Miss Cole who resides at the corner of Speen St. and Old Conn. Path, whose land extends almost to Bannister Brook. She complained about rubbish, garbage, bottles, cans, etc. which is dumped there and interferes with the running of the brook. Chief McCarthy stated it is used as a municipal dump, that there is a fire going there all the time. He said a Mr. Holt works at the dump. Miss Cole stated that Mr. Holt gets paid only by what he gets out of it, and that the fires are set after 7 o'clock at night. Chief McCarthy stated it is under Primo Silva's department. He further stated that at night there are fires and smoke. Miss Cole stated it is not supposed to be a public dump. Chief McCarthy stated he talked with Mr. Silva who advised the Chief that they allow the Hodgman and Dennison to go there. Mr. Galvani asked if it was supervised dumping, to which the reply was "yes" and the Chief further stated that Mr. Holt works there for the salvage he can get out of it. Miss Cole stated she had been to the Board of Public Works and they said the incinerator was not big enough to do the work. She feels that the brook should be cleaned out, and she thinks the Street Department is responsible for some of the dirt. Mr. Galvani stated that the Selectmen have no jurisdiction over the Board of Public Works, but that we can call them in and talk it over. It was decided to talk the matter over with a representative of the Sanitary Division next Tuesday, July 3.

A conference was held with Alden Peterson and Anthony Copabianco of the Trimount Theatres, Inc. in further reference to the question of using their land on Irving St. for

a public parking space. Mr. Peterson stated that their legal representative stated that there is nothing they want to do unless they get equivalent to the taxes. A representative of the Trimount Theatres, Inc., Mr. Giles, told Mr. Peterson that if the Selectmen see their way clear to reduce the Sunday Entertainment License from \$10 to \$5, for each house - amounting to \$520 - to pay the taxes, and to abate the other \$300. He stated that the theatres are paying more than some restaurants, and that they are entitled to a rebate even if there is nothing done on the parking. Mr. Armstrong stated if we did that we would have to do the same for everyone else. Mr. Acton stated that we cannot justify ourselves when we don't get anything in return. Mr. Peterson stated that on the parking situation they would be willing to agree to a year's lease, tenants at will, and he also suggested a price of \$3. for Sunday License. Matter was taken under advisement.


