\*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 4:30 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Angier Corp. for a license to use the land at 50 Fountain St., for the storage of 40,000 gallons of asphalt in two aboveground tanks, 20,000 gallons of heavy fuel oil, in two underground tanks, 4,000 gallons light fuel oil, in two underground tanks, for private use. Mr. E. Dearborn, representing the applicant, was present in favor. No one was present in opposition to it. It was voted to grant the same. ✓

A public hearing was held at 4:45 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Gregg & Son, Inc. for a license to use the land at 21-31 Blandin Ave. for the storage of 8300 gallons of #6 fuel oil (Bunker C) aboveground, for private use.
