No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of the petition and the same was granted. ✓

A hearing was held at 5:43 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of D. Garbarino Co., Inc., Dominic F. Garbarino, Mgr., for an all alcoholic beverage license, as a retailer, at ~~438-440~~ 438-440 Waverly St. Judge James E. Luby, representing the applicant, and Dominic F. Garbarino, were present. Chairman of Selectmen Galvani read a letter received from Fitts Realty, also a letter from Attorney Roy C. Papalia. Judge Luby stated that the D. Garbarino Co., Inc., was a Mass. Corp., and has had a Beer and Wine License since 1932, and had been at their present location for sixty-eight years. He stated further that they have never had a complaint against them in all the time they have carried on business at this location, and that the Garbarino Family contributed to the local, state and federal taxes. He stated further that he had reason to believe that no objection would be made by the landlord to the granting of this license in spite of the letter received by the Board. The Chairman asked counsel for the applicant that if his client were granted a license would he surrender his present license, to which Judge Luby answered that the Corp. had so voted and will surrender the Malt Beverage and Wine License they now hold if the all alcoholic beverage license as a retailer was granted by the Board and approved by the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission. ✓

A hearing was held at 5:51 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Framingham Cafe, Inc., Teresa Taddeo, Pres. & Mgr., for an all alcoholic beverage license, as a common victualer, at 528 Waverly Street. Chairman of Selectmen Galvani read a letter from Father Sartori, Pastor of St. Tarcisius Church, objecting to the granting of this license. Father Sartori was present, and objected to the granting of this license. Attorney J. Walton Tuttle, represented the applicant, and stated that the petitioners have had a license there and never had a complaint regarding the business. He also stated that the Garbarino's were looking for this location, and that the licensee would not consider a new location near the church.

Mr. & Mrs. Taddeo were also present in favor. Attorney A. G. Mainini stated that the Holy Name Society of St. Tarcisius Church objects to the granting of this license, and that there were many children attending church and Sunday School.

A hearing was opened at 6:07 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Pezzoni, Inc., Mario Pezzoni, Mgr., for an all alcoholic beverage license as a common victualer, at 559-561 Hollis St. This hearing was adjourned to the Veterans' Meeting Room because of the large number present. The Chairman of the Board read the application and the letters of objection received by the Board. Arthur King objected to the granting of this license, and stated that he was opposed to any more being granted on the south side. The Reverend Richard Hardy, Pastor of the Park St. Baptist Church, opposed the granting of this license, and stated that one quarter or one third of his constituents live in this area. Mrs. Sam Martino objected to the granting of this license. Mrs. Annie M. Gates also objected to the granting of this license, and asked when the census was taken which gave the town the authority to grant additional licenses, and the Chairman advised her it was January 1, 1950. Reverend Victor G. Dawe, Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, objected to the granting of this license, and stated that the Reverend George D. Cleland, Jr., and the Reverend Mr. McNeil of Grace Congregational Church, Reverend Lawrence DeLozier of the First Baptist Church in Framingham Centre, were opposed to the granting of this license. Peter Ferro and Biagio Ferro, also Lloyd Gates, were opposed to the granting of this license. Curtis B. Dooling, Esq., represented the petitioner, and questioned William J. Pezzoni, Vice Pres. of Corp., son of Mario Pezzoni who is the Manager. He stated that his father was ill in bed and under the doctor's orders, and could not be present. In answer to Attorney Dooling's question he stated that his business had been carried on at his present location for thirty-two years, and Beer and Wine had been sold there for seventeen years. He also stated that new houses had been built in the vicinity and on adjoining land, and that his father owns the building. The property is worth \$30,000. to \$40,000. He further stated that the nearest all alcoholic beverage restaurant license is the Shamrock, approximately 1½ miles away.

He stated that there is approximately 2,000 people living within a half mile radius, and that the police had never found it necessary to go to this place of business, that he, himself, had worked both full and part time on the licensed premises since he was 21 years of age. He presented a petition which he stated was signed by one hundred thirty taxpayers, all of whom live within a few hundred of yards and many of whom were present and favored the granting of this license. Attorney Dooling questioned the following people: Harold M. Johnson, Joseph Merusi, Harold Denham, Nero Bosconi, Ernest G. Bruno, Loretta G. Scansaroli, Josephine Porcello, Charles Butchok. All those questioned by Attorney Dooling stated that they had not seen anything going on at the place of business conducted by the applicant which was objectionable, and they were all in favor of the granting of the license. Many of those in favor have small children who have never been molested, and many of them own property adjoining the licensed premises or within a short distance therefrom. Attorney Dooling stated that he knew a person could become intoxicated by drinking beer and wine as well as drinking all alcoholic beverages. He called the Board's attention to the fact that the people residing in this precinct voted overwhelmingly for the sale of liquor at the last state election, and that there was no valid argument against the granting of this license.

A hearing was held at 6:59 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of John Borghi d/b/a Waverly Cafe for an all alcoholic beverage license, as a common victualer, at 866 Waverly St. The Chairman of the Board read the letter received from Mr. & Mrs. Edward C. Roberts objecting to the granting of this license. The applicant stated that the abutters had told him they were not opposed to his getting this license.

MOTOR VEHICLE CONFERENCE

A conference was held with Wilson L. Pollard of Pollard Motor Sales regarding his application for a Motor Vehicle Class II License at 121 Waverly St. He was advised that the Board would grant this license with the understanding that it would be revoked if the business was not properly conducted.


