Gillis and Burke of the State Rent Control Office, Mr. Acton stated that the Board was seeking information as far as the Rent Control Act affects this town and how the town should consider the Rent Control. Mr. Acton further stated that he believed it goes out in June of this year if the town does not vote to continue, and he thought the representatives of the State Rent Control office should clarify it for the benefit of the Selectmen and for the benefit of our own local Rent Control Board. The state representative stated that the rent control provides that cities and towns can extend rent controls for nine months, to March 1, 1955 and that it will be necessary to have a town meeting. Mr. Gillis stated that local Boards make decisions until proven wrong, and the State serves in an advisory capacity.

ADJOURNMENT

The Board adjourned at 6 o'clock P.M.
