
This meeting was called for the purpose of making an estimate of the temporary increased resident population of Framingham as of July 10, 1955.

Hartnett, seconded by John M. Kennedy, it was voted that the temporary increased resident population of Framingham, as of July 10, 1955, will be 2,200.


