APPOINTMENT

Mrs. Harriett Wittenborg was appointed Chairman for Framingham for the Tenth Anniversary of the United Nations.

CHIEF ENGINEER

Chief Engineer Mackey reported on the cost of constructing Bishop Street under Chapter 90. The cost for Framingham would be \$60,000.00, and the cost for Natick would be \$30,000.00, one-fourth of which cost would be carried by the respective towns. This figure does not include the cost of land takings which are unknown. It is doubtful that Natick would cooperate because they would receive little or no benefit from this road. He also reported that the Public Works Department had mapped out the Chapter 90 program for the next two years in Natick and did not include Bishop Street.


Mr. Mackey also reported that some flood damage had occurred in Athenaeum Hall in Saxonville. He was instructed to confer with the Department of Public Safety representative, and obtain his approval on the proposed repairs.

LOAN AUTHORIZED

It was voted to approve the borrowing of \$2,880,000.00 for the construction of a Senior High and Vocational School, by the Treasurer-Collector, as voted in Article 2 of the special town meeting on January 5, 1955, and approved by the Emergency Finance Board on August 30, 1955.
