Co. for one pole location on Speen St., approximately 15' south of Cochituate Rd., (one existing JO pole to be removed). No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 2:30 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for four pole locations, guy wire and anchor on 4th pole, on Cochituate Rd., southerly side, westerly from a point approximately 135 ft. west of Speen St., (four existing JO poles to be removed). No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 3 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of B. Perini & Sons, Inc. for a license to use the land at 73 Montwaite Avenue for the storage of 3,000 gallons of fuel oil, in one tank underground, and 1,000 gallons of gasoline, in one tank underground, for private use. Mr. Soma, representing the applicant, appeared in favor of the granting of the license. It was voted to grant the license.

LIQUOR LICENSES

At 3:10 o'clock P.M. John C. Acton made a motion that the Board sit as a licensing board. John M. Kennedy seconded this motion and it was unanimously voted.

John M. Kennedy made a motion that the following licenses be granted:

- 1 All Alcoholic Beverage Package Store.
- 1 All Alcoholic Beverage on the premises.
- 1 All Alcoholic Beverage Club.
- 1 Beer and Wine package store.

The motion was not seconded. It was voted on by the Board and it failed to pass.

Norman B. Hartnett made a motion that three All Alcoholic Licenses be granted to two club applicants and one common victualer applicant, and that one package beer and wine license be granted. It was not seconded. It was voted on by the Board and failed to pass.

John C. Acton made a motion that three All Alcoholic Beverage licenses be granted which would include one package store and two common victualers, and also that one beer and wine package store license be granted.

John C. Acton made the following statement:

I believe that these licenses are made possible by the legislature

for the convenience of the public at large. The Town of Framingham is over licensed by two as far as clubs are concerned, and, therefore, we would not be following the intent of the legislature if we satisfied the private interest of a group to the detriment of public convenience.

This motion was seconded by John M. Kennedy and was passed by unanimous vote.

John C. Acton made a motion to grant two All Alcoholic Common Victualer's licenses. This motion was seconded by Norman B. Hartnett and passed by unanimous vote.

Nominations were accepted for the Common Victualer's All Alcoholic Beverage licenses as follows:

John M. Kennedy nominated The Coffee Shop, and this motion was seconded by John C. Acton.

Norman B. Hartnett nominated Earl J. Haley. It was not seconded.

John C. Acton nominated the Turnpike Steakhouse inc. This motion was seconded by John M. Kennedy.

John C. Acton made a motion that The Coffee Shop and the Turnpike Steakhouse inc. be granted Common Victualer's All Alcoholic Beverage licenses by unanimous vote.

John M. Kennedy seconded his motion, and it was voted unanimously that The Coffee Shop and the Turnpike Steakhouse inc. be granted Common Victualer's All Alcoholic Beverage Licenses.

John C. Acton made a motion to grant an All Alcoholic Beverage package store license. This motion was seconded by John M. Kennedy and unanimously voted.

John C. Acton nominated 93 Hollis, Inc. to receive an All Alcoholic Beverage package store license. This motion was seconded by Norman B. Hartnett and unanimously voted.

John C. Acton made a motion to grant a Beer and Wine package store license, and Norman B. Hartnett seconded the motion, and it was unanimously voted.

John M. Kennedy nominated Dom's. His motion was not seconded.

Norman B. Hartnett nominated Angelo R. Natoli. This motion was seconded by John C. Acton.

There were no further nominations.

John C. Acton made a motion that Angelo R. Natoli be awarded the


Beer and Wine package store license by unanimous vote, and it was so voted.
