\*CONFERENCES\*

A conference was held with Fire Chief Trevett at 2 o'clock P.M. The Chief reported that Private John K. Ahearn has not yet applied for retirement and will be carried for one more week in accordance with the decision of last week.

Hannah Broverman of the Accounting Department appeared at 2:10 P.M., and requested that a special article be placed in the town meeting changing her to Accounting Clerk III. The matter was taken under consideration.

A conference was held at 4 o'clock P.M., with Charles Canning, Director of the Framingham Housing Authority, who represented said Housing Authority and requested that the Board of Selectmen write to the State Housing Authority stating their intentions in regard to one house remaining unsold in the project built in 1948. It was decided to write such a letter asking for an additional years extension of the time limit while the town completed studies as to the advisability of constructing a police or fire station on this site.

Police Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 4:10 o'clock P.M. and stated that he had talked to representatives of DeMatteo Const. Co. and Savin Const. Co., and also with the State Department of Public Works regarding signs on the by-pass over the Toll Road and was informed that these signs were the responsibility of the Turnpike Authority who would take steps to correct them.

A Mr. Stern, engineer representing Savin Const. Co., conferred with the Board at 4:20 o'clock P.M. regarding signs on the by-pass over route 9 at the Toll Road interchange. He stated that he was not familiar with the situation because he was recently assigned here, and was informed that the Turnpike Authority would correct the matter, and he was asked to check on them.

William McGraw, representing Mrs. Louis Grandoni, conferred with the Board at 4:30 o'clock P.M., requesting that the Board set prices for the rental of Athenaeum Hall. He was informed that prices would be set and Mrs. Grandoni so informed.

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### \*TAXI STAND\*

The Board voted to grant Arnold Martinelli permission to use the taxi stand located at the corner of Hollis and Waverly Streets (formerly in name of his brother, Geno Martinelli).

### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 2:20 o'clock P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition for the layout of Gregory Road, from Water Street to Whittemore Road, as and for a public way. The Chief Engineer's report was read: Buildings \$47,484.; land \$7,775.; 8½ houses; anticipated five year revenue, \$12,986. It was voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the next annual town meeting.

A public hearing was held at 2:30 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition for the layout of Burbank Circle, from Hadley Road to end, as and for a public way. The Chief Engineer's report was read: Buildings \$28,991.; land \$5787.; five houses; anticipated five year revenue \$8032. The Board voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the next annual town meeting.

A public hearing was held at 2:40 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition for the layout of Oakvale Road, from Davidson Road and end, as and for a public way. The Chief Engineer's report was read: Buildings \$148,307.; land \$25,536.; twenty-seven houses; anticipated five year revenue \$40,852. The Board voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the next annual town meeting.

A public hearing was held at 2:50 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition for the layout of Hadley Road, from Potter Road and end, as and for a public way. The Chief Engineer's report was read: Buildings \$122,309.; land \$21,126.; twenty-three houses; anticipated five year revenue \$33,706. The Board voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the next annual town meeting.

A public hearing was held at 3:30 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition for the layout of Davidson Road, from Gregory Road to Hadley Road, as and for a public way. The Chief Engineer's report was read: Buildings \$185,552.; land \$31,007.; thirty-three houses; anticipated five year revenue \$50,892. The Board voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the next annual town meeting.

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A public hearing was held at 3:45 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition for the layout of Whittemore Road, from Hemenway Road and Davidson Road, as and for a public way. The Chief Engineer's report was read: Buildings \$179,244.; land \$30,536.; 32½ houses; anticipated five year revenue \$49,298. The Board voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the next annual town meeting.

Precinct 6 - Margaret O'Connor moved out of Precinct 2 by the Selectmen into Precinct 6 as an inspector.


Precinct 6 - Alice E. Dyer, inspector.
