\*BIDS ON PARK LAND\*

Bids on the park land located at the corner of Beaver and Waverly Streets, Framingham, as authorized by Article 36 of the annual town meeting of March 14, 1956 were opened at 2 o'clock P.M., and received from the following:

Mass. Transportation Company, Inc., John S. Briggs, President, \$40,300.00. They plan to erect a terminal if they receive the award.

Trustees of the Denison Realty Trust, Lloyd D. Tarlin, Trustee, \$41,500.00. They plan to erect a Stop & Shop Supermarket Store. The matter was taken under advisement.

\*BIDS FOR RE-ROOFING FIRE STATION\*

Bids for re-roofing the Fire Station, Watson Place, were opened at 2:15 P.M., and received from the following:

The matter was taken under advisement and referred to the Fire Chief for investigation.

\*CONFERENCES\*

Thomas Buckley, representing the Toll Road Authority, conferred with the Board at 2:25 P.M., and requested the Board to ask for the transfer of installations, etc. to the town as soon as they are completed to specifications. The Board agreed to do so. Mr. Acton asked Mr. Buckley if he had any information regarding the transfer of \$25,000.00 from the

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Toll Road Authority for the construction of sewer line to the Motor Inn in accordance with previous agreements. Mr. Buckley agreed to investigate and notify the Board.

The Fire Chief conferred with the Board at 2:30 P.M. and discussed the condition of the premises at 14 Grant Street. It was decided to ask the owners to meet with the Selectmen on Monday, May 14, to discuss the steps to be taken.

Police Chief Edward T. McCarthy conferred with the Board at 3:20 P.M. He was authorized to purchase a 1956 Ford, 6 passenger Country Sedan, with Fordomatic transmission and police motor, from Butler Motor Corp. in the amount of \$1800.

Frank Generazzio conferred with the Board at 3:40 P.M. and objected to the Board of Selectmen signing an agreement with the Lexington Sand & Gravel Co. to amend court decree regarding the use of their sandpit. He requested that the Board agree only to the terms established by the court, and submitted a petition signed by sixteen residents requesting an opportunity to be heard, preferably a public hearing. Mr. Kennedy asked what disadvantage could arise from such an agreement since the Lexington Sand & Gravel Co. can operate under the court decree without restrictions and use all town roads. Mr. Acton stated that the only concession made by the town was a wet classification plant - all other items in the agreement were inserted by the town. The Town Counsel was instructed to rewrite the agreement to restrict operation to a wet or dry mobile classification plant. The matter was taken under advisement.

\*PURCHASE OF PARK LAND\*

Motion was made to accept the bid of the Trustees of the Denison Realty Trust, Lloyd D. Tarlin, Trustee, to purchase the park land at Beaver and Waverly Streets for \$41,500.00. It was unanimously voted.

Motion was made to reject the bid of the Mass. Transportation Company, Inc. and to return their check. It was unanimously voted.

\*FRANKLIN SCHOOL\*

It was voted to request the Chief Engineer to secure an estimate of the cost of wrecking the Franklin School.

### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 2:35 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission: Concord Street, starting at Lincoln Street at manhole #224, in a northeasterly direction approximately 4934' of underground conduit to manhole #235 and including four (4) manholes, #231, 232, 233 and 234. No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

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A public hearing was held at 2:45 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Thompson Bros. for a license to use the land at 959 Pleasant Street for the storage of 500 gallons of gasoline, in one tank underground, for private use. No one appeared to oppose it, and it was granted.

A public hearing was held at 3 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of John Meloni for a license to use the land at the rear of 767 Waverly Street for an eight car repair and body shop and for the storage of 250 gallons, aboveground, of paint and lacquer thinners. Mrs. Maria Montesi appeared to object. She stated that her property was 3' from the garage where Mr. Meloni proposed to store paints, and requested that the garage be fireproofed. Mr. Meloni stated that while Mrs. Montesi's property was 3' from the garage, her house was at least 50' from the garage. The matter was taken under advisement, and referred to the Fire Chief who was instructed to contact Mrs. Montesi.
