BUILDING INSPECTOR

It was voted to authorize the Building Inspector to issue a building permit to Herbert R. Church, Jr., 61 Davidson Road, for the purpose of constructing a wood frame garage with an 11' side yard at his property, at 61 Davidson Road.

It was voted to authorize the Building Inspector to issue a building permit to Gordon C. Hulbert, 28 Pond Street, for the purpose of constructing a wood frame garage 4' from his side line.

PETITION

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Elm Street, westerly side approximately 70' north of Chestnut Street, (one existing JO pole to be removed), was granted.

EXTENSION OF TIME - LIQUOR

It was voted to allow liquor licensees, where liquor is sold on the premises, to sell and serve liquor until 1 A.M. on Monday, November 12, 1956.

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HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 2:30 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Carlo Bravo for a license to use the land at 1617 Concord Street for the storage of 5,000 gallons, additional, gasoline in one tank underground. He was represented by Robert S. Davis who presented return receipts indicating he had notified abutters. There was no objection to the granting of the license, and it was voted to grant the license.

A public hearing was held at 2:45 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Cities Service Oil Co. for a license to use the land at 999-1001 Worcester Road for the storage of 5,000 additional gallons of gasoline, in one underground tank. He was represented by Robert S. Davis who presented return receipts indicating he had notified abutters. There was no objection to the granting of the license, and it was voted to grant the license.

A public hearing was held at 3 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Reverend William J. Callahan for a license to use the land at 219 Concord Street for the storage of 5,000 gallons of #2 fuel oil, in one underground tank, for private use. Reverend William J. Callahan represented St. Stephen's Parish, and presented return receipts indicating he had notified abutters. There was no objection to the granting of the license, and it was voted to grant the license.

A public hearing was held at 3 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Reverend William J. Callahan for a license to use the land at 30 Clinton Street for the storage of 2,000 gallons of #2 fuel oil, in one underground tank, for private use. Reverend William J. Callahan represented St. Stephen's Parish, and presented return receipts indicating he had notified abutters. There was no objection to the granting of the license, and it was voted to grant the license.

CONFERENCES

Chief Engineer Mackey and Public Works Director Paxton conferred with the Board at 3:30 P.M. regarding the use of the Speen Street dump. Mr. Paxton stated that the Public Works Department will need this dump for dumping purposes for an indefinite period. They could use additional fill if the Toll Road has it available. He estimated they would need the dump at least until June, 1957 because the incinerator needs additional water to operate both furnaces. He felt that industrial waste may cause other problems at the incinerator. He stated that there is no other available dumping area which could handle such material.

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Mr. Acton asked Mr. Paxton to have the Public Works Commissioners arrange a meeting with the Turnpike Authority representatives to attempt to reach a suitable agreement. He stated that the Turnpike Authority would supply fill at this time. Chief Engineer Mackey informed the Board that the land in question is owned partly by Fitts, partly by Wyman, and partly by the Town of Framingham.

Dr. Francis Feola and Dr. Robert A. MacCready conferred with the Board at 4:15 P.M. regarding a fund raising campaign for the South Middlesex Association for Retarded Children, Inc. Dr. Feola stated that he felt that permission should be given because the drive is for a most worthy cause. Dr. MacCready stated that the organization is approximately four years old, and is composed of a National organization with subordinate state and local organizations. He felt that the Association was extremely important because it deals with a common disorder which has a rate of incidence higher than polio, or cerebral palsy, etc. He further informed the Board that the drive includes approximately twenty towns in the district, and Framingham is the only town in the state which has not granted permission to solicit funds. After more discussion it was voted to grant permission to the South Middlesex Association for Retarded Children, Inc. to solicit funds from door to door in the Town of Framingham.

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 5 P.M. on various departmental matters. It was voted to appoint the three patrolmen whose names appear on the eligible list submitted by the Civil Service, effective November 12, 1956:
