APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

The application of Joseph Mullen, Framingham, and others not residents of Framingham, for a certificate of incorporation under the name of the "Polecat Ski Club, Inc." to be located in the City of Malden, was approved so far as the resident of Framingham is concerned.

PETITION

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Concord St., northwesterly side approximately 225' southwest of Old Connecticut Path, was granted.

CONFERENCES

Fire Chief Leroy Trevett conferred with the Board at 2:15 P.M. on various departmental matters.

The contract for alterations and improvements to the Hollis Street Fire Station was awarded to James W. Copithorne & Son, Inc., Deloss Place, Framingham, in the amount of \$6320.00 in accordance with their bid of November 13, 1956.

Dog Officer M. Harry Kinnarney and his assistant, Vincent Malone, together with Mr. & Mrs. Philip Weir conferred with the Board at 2:45 P.M. regarding the disappearance of a black dog owned by Mr. Weir while the dog was in the custody of Mr. Malone, who was acting as Dog Officer during the illness of Mr. Kinnarney. Mr. Malone informed the Board that he picked up the dog at Mr. Briggs home in the Apple D'Or section of Framingham, and also picked up a female owned by Mr. Briggs. He placed both dogs in his truck and secured them with a choke collar. Later in the afternoon while he was making a stop near Marconi's Restaurant Mr. Weir's dog escaped from the truck and has not been seen since. Mr. Kinnarney informed the Board that on Thanksgiving Day he received a call that a black dog had been seen in the area of Lake Waushakum at the time and when he arrived in the area, the dog could not be found. Mr. Weir stated that it was his feeling that the dog would have returned home if the circumstances had been as described by Mr. Malone and Mr. Kinnarney. He does not believe their story. He further stated that he had searched the area of Lake Waushakum after having been informed by Mr. Kinnarney that a black dog had been seen in that area. Mr. Kinnarney was instructed by the Board to prepare a written report and submit it to the Board at their next meeting. The matter was taken under advisement pending this report.

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 3:45 P.M. regarding traffic and parking problems in the Town of Framingham. He was instructed to find out if a green arrow can be installed permitting a right turn from Concord Street to Union Avenue, or whether a sign should be installed indicating that a right turn could be made on a red light. He was also instructed to install a stop sign on Webster Street, at Lawrence Street. It was voted to instruct Chief McCarthy to make Clinton Street one way easterly on a trial basis.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 2:30 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, on the application of the Framingham Country Club for a license to use the land at 25 Parker Road for the storage of 300 gallons of gasoline, in one underground tank, for private use. Attorney John P. Garrahan represented the applicant, and presented return receipts and a plot plan. There were no objections to the license, and it was voted to grant the same.

A public hearing was held at 3 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of L. Natichioni & Sons, Inc. for a license to use the land at 767 Waverly Street for the storage of 6,000 additional gallons of gasoline, in two tanks underground. Louis A. Natichioni presented return receipts and presented a plot plan. Attorney Dewey C. Kadra represented Mrs. Montesi, an abuttor, and stated that she has no objection to this petition. The matter was taken under advisement pending the approval of the Fire Chief.

The Board adjourned at 4:30 o'clock P.M.
