PETITION

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel.
Co. for one pole on "A" St., northwesterly side, approximately 15'
northeast of Cherry St., was granted.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 2:30 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's
Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. &
Tel. Co. for the following permission: Waverly St., approximately 880'
of underground conduit from manhole #207 west to and including manhole
#208, Bethany Rd., approximately 200' of underground conduit from pole
#5/2 northerly to manhole #208 on Concord St. There were no objections
to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 2:30 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's
Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. &
Tel. Co. for the following permission: Elm St., approximately 212' of
underground conduit from pole #511/3 south to Concord St., Concord St.,
approximately 29' of underground conduit from Elm St., south to and
including manhole #600, Concord St., approximately 165' of underground
conduit from manhole #600 south to pole #189, Central St., approximately
147' of underground conduit from pole #31/1 easterly to manhole #600 at
Concord St. There were no objections to the granting of this petition,
and the same was granted.

CONFERENCES

Attorney John St. Andre, Building Inspector Ayer, and Fire Chief
Trevett conferred with the Board at 2:45 P.M. regarding Smitty's Garage
and Service Center. Mr. St. Andre informed the Board that Smitty's
has reinforced the floor, put up a fire wall similar to the one at
Butler Motors, installed gas heating unit, explosive proof electric
fixtures, an exhaust fan, and an overhead door, and have made
arrangements to pour a cement floor. He feels that Smitty's have

done a good job at keeping traffic to a minimum, and have made an effort to keep their vehicles off the street. Smitty's Garage presently operates under a garage license originally issued to Billington Motors in 1931. It was the opinion of the Building Inspector, Chief Trevett and Town Counsel Seltzer that there would be no need to reapply to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Mr. St. Andre stated that if the tenant who presently operates the Variety Store in the building were to move, Smitty's Garage would use the entire building, and it would then meet the requirements of the fire laws. He was instructed by the Board to investigate the possibility that the tenant would move in the near future, and also to investigate the possibility of building a fire wall between the portion of the building operated as a garage and the portion of the building used as a variety store. It was decided to continue the hearing until some future time, and Chief Trevett and Mr. Ayer are to check on the operation of Smitty's Garage and Service Center.

Fire Chief Trevett conferred with the Board at 3:30 P.M. regarding various departmental matters, and the salary requests for 1957. He suggested the following salaries:

Victor H. Galvani, Esq., conferred with the Board at 4:15 P.M. regarding claim of Vito Tristianio for injuries received in a fall on the sidewalk on Bridges St. on February 2, 1956 at which time he suffered a bad leg fracture, and was hospitalized for six weeks. The Town Counsel was authorized to settle the claim for \$388.50.

Police Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 4:25 P.M. On the recommendation of the Police Chief, it was voted to replace the parking meters on Concord St., between Lincoln St. and Frederick St., and to prohibit parking all day on Ordway Street, from Union Ave. to Sanger Street, on Sanger Street, from Ordway Street to Concord Street, to prohibit parking on Concord Street, from Lincoln Street to Memorial Square between the hours of 4 and 6 P.M. These regulations are to be made on a temporary basis until after the Christmas holidays.
