* CONFERENCES *

Attorney Harold L. Fleitman conferred with the Board at 7:40 P.M. regarding bill for services rendered in the case of the Wilson Freight Co. vs. the Zoning Board of Appeals.

He stated that his original bill had been submitted prematurely because the decree did not become final until January 11, 1960. He stated that the bill was based on schedules of the South Middlesex and Worcester Bar Association.

Chief Engineer Mackey, and Paul V. Crague and residents of Little Tree Lane conferred with the Board at 8:10 P.M. regarding drainage problems on Little Tree Lane, and the easements to be taken by SUASCO in connection with the federal flood control program.

Mr. Crague stated that SUASCO has had to proceed slowly because of the legal problems involved. They plan to meet with the Baiting Brook Committee on January 27, 1960 in the Memorial Building. They requested that the Selectmen be represented at this meeting, and he felt that this meeting could result in securing all the easements that would be necessary and suggested that the Board withhold any action until after January 27.

He further stated that the federal government will make federal funds available for the project. Once the easements have been taken, it should be completed within three or four weeks.

The matter was taken under advisement.

The Board agreed to investigate the matter and notify Mr. Crague and Mr. Ambuter.

Chief Engineer Mackey conferred with the Board at 8:45 P.M. regarding off st. parking in the Town of Framingham.

Peter J. Bacigalupo, Malcolm Winsor and Dog Officer Lee Berte conferred with the Board at 9:05 P.M. regarding complaints about Mr. Bacigalupo's dog.

No hearing was held.

Mr. Bacigalupo agreed to remove the dog from Framingham within two weeks and to restrain it during that period.

PLANNING BOARD

It was voted to request the Planning Board to withhold any action on the request of Pinewood Builders, Inc. regarding the installation of posts on Hadley Road pending a report from the Town Counsel.

TOWN COUNSEL

It was voted to have Morris Shapiro, Town Counsel, investigate the legality of leasing of town owned land to private parties for parking purposes.

SELECTMEN'S BUDGET

The Selectmen's budget was discussed.

John T. Dias voted in favor of signing the Resolution.


