HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for two pole locations on Hemenway Road, westerly side, northerly from a point approximately 145' north of Water St. (two existing JO poles to be removed). No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Edgell Rd., southeasterly side, approximately 20' northeast of Scott Drive (two existing JO poles to be removed). No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A hearing was held at 8:30 P.M. on the charges by Police Chief Edward T. McCarthy that Patrolman Henry E. Richards had failed to report for duty since December 16, 1959.

Patrolman Richards had been notified by registered mail at his last known address, and failed to appear or to be represented by counsel.

It was unanimously voted to discharge Patrolman Richards effective January 20, 1960, for failure to report for duty.

CONFERENCES

Mr. Martino, Mrs. Redden, and Attorney Shea conferred with the Board at 8:10 P.M. regarding the constant disturbance by Smitty's Cab on Sanger St.

Attorney Shea informed the Board that the Smitty's cabs park in restricted areas and cars and the trucks are being warmed up during the early hours. As a result the trucks and cars are repaired on the street and the two-way radio can be heard all hours of the day and night. The neighbors have been verbally abused by both the owners and taxi drivers, and the police have been called, but this serves as a temporary remedy only. Parking regulations on the south side of Sanger St. were adopted by the Board of Selectmen on November 19, 1940, and he suggested that this parking regulation be enforced.

Mrs. Redden informed the Board that her health had been impaired by constant noise and the dirty establishment of Smitty's. During the summer they burn trash and garbage outdoors. She stated she had lived in that house twenty-seven years.

CONFERENCES-cont.

Mr. Martino informed the Board that his complaints were substantially the same as those of Mrs. Redden. He also stated that his elderly mother had been subjected to verbal abuse by Smitty's and their employees. He stated that there are twelve or fourteen cars parked on the roadway and several junk cars park in the area.

Chief McCarthy was instructed to see that the wrecked cars were removed immediately, to enforce the 1940 parking regulations, and to inform the Smiths that these complaints had been received and that further complaints would result in revocation of their license to operate taxicabs.

Attorney Seltzer, Esq., conferred with the Board at 10 P.M. regarding the case of Christine Boileau vs. Town of Framingham for injuries suffered as a result of an alleged sidewalk defect.

It was unanimously voted to authorize the Town Counsel to settle this case for \$500.00. Attorney Seltzer agreed to confer with his client.

(Attorney Seltzer called at 10 A.M. on Wednesday, January 20, 1960 to indicate that the settlement was satisfactory to his client).

EXTRA HOUR

On motion of Richard D. Mahoney, it was unanimously voted to grant permission to the Monticello Restaurant to remain open for an additional hour on the evenings of Friday, January 22 and Friday, January 29, 1960, for the purpose of serving food and alcoholic beverages.

QUESTION TO BE PLACED ON OFFICIAL TOWN BALLOT

It was unanimously voted that the following question would be placed on the official town ballot to be used at the 1960 annual town election:

"Shall the town pay one-half of the premium costs payable by a retired employee for group life insurance and for group general or blanket hospital, surgical and medical insurance?"

APPOINTMENT

George B. O'Donnell was appointed a special police officer for a term of one year.

PETITION


