Attorney Louis J. Ferrari conferred with the Board at 8:30 P.M. regarding the unpaid bill of the Ashland Sand & Gravel Co. He stated that after conferring with the Town Accountant and Town Counsel he agrees the only basis for recovery for the amount due is on the basis that it is a moral obligation of the town. It is necessary to submit the bill to the Legislature and an article to the town meeting. He has prepared the bill for the Legislature, but he needs the approval of the Board of Selectmen to have the bill admitted by the Legislature since it is beyond the filing date.

It was voted to recommend that the Legislature admit this bill under suspension of the rules.

It was voted to recommend a pension for Mrs. Agnes D. Kohler, widow of William F. Kohler, a former fireman, under the provisions of Section 95, 96, 97, Chapter 32.

\*APPOINTMENT\*

Nicola Bertocci was appointed a special police officer for a term of one year.

\*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Second St., westerly side, approximately 100' south of Waverly St. (one existing JO pole to be removed). The matter was taken under advisement pending a report from the Chief Engineer.

A public hearing was held at 8:45 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of James L. Nelson and others to lay out Longview Rd., from McPhee Rd. west and south to a point approximately 792', as and for a public way.

The Chief Engineer reported that the street is 792' long, 40' wide, there are eighteen houses, total valuation \$160,050.00, anticipated five year revenue \$49,615.50. The Chief Engineer recommended that the street be installed at no expense to the town - street, sewer and drain built by developer.

It was voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the annual town meeting.

A public hearing was held at 8:50 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of James J. Hoar and others to lay out Checkerberry Lane, from Hodder Lane to end, as and for a public way.

The Chief Engineer reported that the street is 660' long, 40' wide, there are five houses, total valuation \$84,100., anticipated five year revenue \$26,071. The Chief Engineer recommended that the street be installed at no expense to the town - street, sewer and drain built by developer.

It was voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the annual town meeting.

A public hearing was held at 8:55 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of Stephanie Abrams and others to lay out Mark Rd., from Bradford Rd. to Ashmont Drive, as and for a public way.

The Chief Engineer reported that the street is 629' long, 40' wide, there are eight houses, total valuation \$59,625.00, anticipated five year revenue \$18,483.75. The Chief Engineer recommended that the street be installed at no expense to the town - street, sewer and drain built by developer.

It was voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the annual town meeting.


A public hearing was held at 9 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of Allen West and others to lay out Springhill Rd., from Brownlea Rd. to Brownlea Rd., as and for a public way.

The Chief Engineer reported that the street is 1971' long, 50' wide, there are thirty-eight houses, total valuation \$272,925., anticipated five year revenue \$84,606.75. The Chief Engineer recommended that the street be installed at no expense to the town - street, sewer and drain built by developer.

It was voted to recommend the acceptance of this street at the annual town meeting.
