REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN MARCH 15, 1960

The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held at 7:30 P.M.

LICENSES GRANTED

Licenses were granted to the following:

TOWN TREASURER

It was unanimously voted to approve the request of Albert E. Cole,
Town Treasurer, to borrow \$500,000.00 in anticipation of the 1960 taxes.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office,
Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel.
Co. for the following permission: Worcester Road, at the intersection
of Library St., one proposed manhole #294A, Worcester Rd., approximately
10' of underground conduit from proposed manhole #294A, southeasterly to
existing conduit, Worcester Rd., approximately 15' of underground conduit
from proposed manhole #294A, westerly and thence southwesterly to existing
conduit, Worcester Rd., approximately 8' of underground conduit from
proposed manhole #294A, northwesterly to existing conduit. No one was
present objecting to the granting of this petition, and the same was
granted.

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Hearings-cont.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Stony Brook Rd., southeasterly side, approximately 75' northeast of Flagg Drive, one pole location on Stony Brook Rd., northwesterly side, approximately 205' northeast of Flagg Drive. There was no objection to the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location, guy wire and anchor on Newbury St., southerly side, approximately 90' east of Old Conn. Path. There was no objection to the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one guy wire and anchor on Newbury St., southerly side, from a pole located approximately 230' east of Old Conn. Path. There was no objection at the hearing, and the petition was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location, guy wire and anchor on Cochituate Rd., northwesterly side, approximately 1765' northeast of Greenview St., (one existing JO pole to be removed). There was no objection present at the hearing, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Lawrence St., northeasterly side, approximately 310' southeast of Grant St. There was no objection present, and the permission was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one iron guy pole on Concord St., easterly side, approximately 80' north of Danforth St. There was no objection at the hearing, and the petition was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on LaSalle Ave., southwesterly side, from a point approximately 121' southeast of Florissant Ave. Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Montana objected to the location of the pole on LaSalle Ave. The matter was taken under advisement, and the Board will refer the petition to the Chief Engineer.

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HEARINGS-cont.

A public hearing was held at 8:15 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission: Old Conn. Path, southwesterly from Hamilton St., nine poles, guy wire and anchor on 1st and 6th pole; Old Conn. Path, southeasterly side, approximately 45' northeast of Hamilton St., one pole (these are existing poles, no new poles to be set). Mary and Nettie Brown, Anthony A. Coppola, and Mrs. Bruce Crossman, appeared at the hearing. The matter was taken under advisement. The Board agreed to confer with the Chief Engineer.

A public hearing was held at 8:30 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Crawford's Service Inc. for a license to use the land at 1666 - 1668 Worcester Road for the storage of 2,000 gallons of propane gas in one aboveground tank. Douglas Taylor and Harold Gunsolley representing Crawford's Service Inc., and Harold Ames and Walter Deisel representing Suburban Propane, Sudbury, appeared. Mr. Taylor presented return receipts indicating abutters had been notified. He explained that the propane gas is for resale from refrigeration units on trailers. Mr. Ames explained the procedure for filling tanks. Fire Chief Trevett informed the Board that this is a new product that will be used as an automotive fuel in the future. He explained the regulations set up by the National Fire Protection Association. W. A. Robb stated that he had no objection to the issuance of this license provided that sufficient fire protection would be provided in the area. He stated that the hydrant on the westerly end of the Toll Road Bridge on route 9 is inoperative at this time. Mr. Carey of Gates St. informed the Board that he felt the same as Mr. Robb and was concerned with the lack of fire protection in the area. It was voted to grant the license provided that Crawford's Service Inc. install a 10" reinforced concrete wall extending 2' below the ground and 4' aboveground, and a 4' chain fence to be mounted on top of the concrete wall. No part of the wall is to be within 4' of the tank. It was also voted to write a letter to the Board of Public Works expressing the Board's concern on lack of fire protection in the area on route 9 of the westerly side of the Toll Road.

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CONFERENCES

Chief McCathy conferred with the Board on various departmental matters.

Daniel Connolly, Vincent E. Garino, Henry McKeown, representing the Framingham Redevelopment Authority, conferred with the Board to discuss the Urban Renewal program and Resolution requesting funds for the survey and the articles in the warrant. They agreed to submit a complete application for study by the Board.

PETITIONS

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for five pole locations on Waverly St., southerly side, westerly from a point approximately 210' west of Beaver St., was granted.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Second St., westerly side, approximately 100' south of Waverly St. (one existing JO pole to be removed), on which a public hearing was held February 9, was granted March 15.

APPLICATIONS FOR LIQUOR LICENSES

It was voted to deny the application of Howard D. Johnson Company for a Common Victualer's All Alcoholic Beverage license inasmuch as no such license is presently available.

The Board voted to deny the application of Arthur M. Zontini for an All Alcoholic Beverage Package Store License and All Alcoholic Beverage Common Victualer's License inasmuch as no such licenses are presently available.

APPOINTMENT

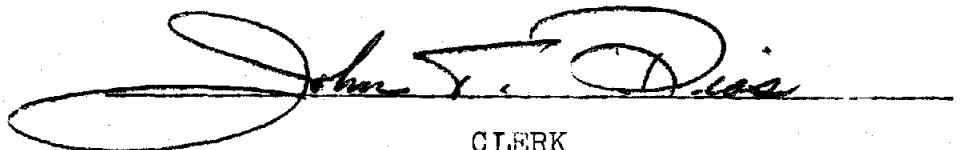
Richard D. Mahoney nominated William D. Kerr as a member of the Industrial Development Commission, for a term of five years, replacing Donald Johnson who declined.
