*USE OF SPACE IN FRONT OF
MEMORIAL BUILDING*

It was voted to approve the request of the Framingham Young Women's Club to use the apron in front of the Memorial Building for a voting booth and sale of tickets, April 18 to May 7, 1960, in conjunction with the "Follies".

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. for one pole location on Pleasant St., southerly side, approximately 135' east of Church Green. No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the same.

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HEARINGS - cont.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Pleasant St., south-westerly side, approximately 210' southeast of Maynard Road (two existing JO poles to be removed). No one was present favoring or opposing the petition, and it was voted to grant same.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for six pole locations on Indian Head Rd., northerly side, westerly from a point approximately 310' west of Summer St., one pole location on Indian Head Road, southerly side, approximately 10' west of Donna Road. No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for four pole locations on Cochituate Road, southerly side, easterly from a point approximately 620' east of Greenview St., (six existing JO poles to be removed). No one was present in favor of, or in opposition to, the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

CONFERENCES

Donald Askin of the State Lumber Co. conferred with the Board at 8:35 P.M. regarding parking on Concord St., Saxonville. He stated that the merchants requested that the Board order two hour parking on the westerly side of Concord St. to prevent the employees of the Roxbury Carpet Co. from parking there all day leaving no space for the customers.

Chief McCarthy recommended that the Board order one hour parking from Danforth St. to Watson Place, and this was unanimously voted.

It was voted to restrict parking to one hour on the westerly side of Concord St., from Danforth St. to Watson Place.

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 8:45 P.M. on various departmental matters.

John T. Dias made a motion that the Board commend Sergeant Dino Berte and Patrolman Joseph V. MacCarthy for their work in apprehending the suspect in the burglary at Brewster's establishment, and to grant them two additional days off.

It was voted to send letters of commendation to these officers, and the motion to grant the officers two days off was not seconded.

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CONFERENCES-cont.

Paul Craigue and Chief Engineer Mackey conferred with the Board at 10 P.M. regarding drainage in Birch Meadow area. The Engineer informed the Board that the town has the right to start as soon as easements are filed, and that the Board of Public Works has informed him that work will be started as soon as possible.

Cornelius J. Sullivan, Town Counsel, stated that easements will be filed Wednesday, April 13.

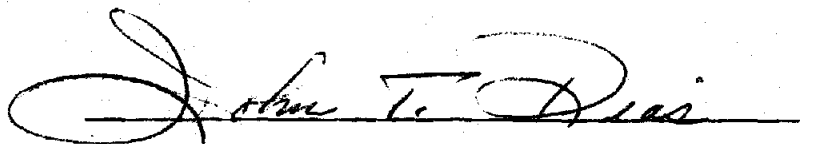
