\*CONFERENCE\*

J. Emery Guertin, Joseph F. Shay, Frank A. Terhune, and Ernest F. Garbano, representing the Finance Committee, conferred with the Board of Selectmen at 8 P.M.

Mr. Guertin acted as spokesman for the group. He informed the Board that the Finance Committee had heard that certain departments had collected fees and had failed to turn them into the Town Treasurer. It was the intention of the Finance Committee to inform the Board of this matter for the purpose of seeing that all town departments are informed that all receipts of any nature must be turned into the Town Treasurer in the future. It is the opinion of the Finance Committee that this practice has been going on for a number of years and it is possible that the people involved do not realize there is any illegality connected with their procedures. The Finance Committee feels that no particular individual should be singled out for legal action at this time, and wish to recommend that no such action be taken and that the efforts of both boards should be directed to prevent a recurrence of this problem. They agreed to send a letter to the Board of Selectmen confirming this position.

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 8:30 P.M. on various departmental matters.

The alleged violation of the restrictions placed on Mr. Norton regarding the keeping of commercial vehicles on his property on Beaver St. was discussed. Chief McCarthy was instructed to have the premises checked regularly by the cruiser and also to visit Mr. Norton with Francis J. Smith, Building Inspector, to be certain that he understands the restrictions that have been imposed pending the outcome of his appeal.

\*FINANCE COMMITTEE\*

It was voted to send a letter to the Finance Committee indicating that the Board of Selectmen favored the adoption of a sick leave policy that would grant fifteen days sick leave for each employee, accumulating indefinitely.

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### \*TENANTS - 6-8 GUADALCANAL ROAD\*

It was voted to notify the tenants at 6-8 Guadalcanal Road that the Board of Selectmen intend to re-submit an article requesting permission to dispose of this property, and suggest that they seek other accommodations as soon as possible.

### \*STATION WAGON - FIRE DEPARTMENT\*

Richard D. Mahoney made a motion that the award of the contract to furnish a station wagon for the Fire Department to J. G. Veiro & Son, Inc. be reconsidered.

This motion was not seconded and failed to pass.

### \*RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE\*

It was voted to grant a retirement allowance to Helen Hartnett, widow of Robert F. Hartnett, under the provisions of Section 58 B, Chapter 32 of the General Laws. This pension is to be computed by the State Division of Insurance.

### \*MATTER OF PRECINCTS REALIGNMENT\*

The matter of precincts realignment was discussed.

### \*APPOINTMENT\*

Dana G. Straight was appointed a special police officer for a term of one year.

### \*BUILDING INSPECTOR\*

It was voted to authorize the Building Inspector to issue a permit to John F. Topham to enable him to construct a single dwelling on his property at 60 Singletary Lane with a side yard of 3'.

It was voted to authorize the Building Inspector to issue a building permit to Paul Freiheit, 48 Janebar Circle, to enable him to construct a garage on the abovementioned lot with a side yard of 8'.

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
