The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held at 7:30 P.M.

CONFERENCES

Chief Trevett conferred with the Board at 7:30 P.M. regarding cable bids received June 14, 1960 - low bidder, Inter-City Electric Supply Corp. in the amount of \$5089.42.

Chief Trevett suggested waiting until the next meeting to award any contract for cable since there is some possibility of changing the footage requirements if the underground conduit becomes available.

Chief McOrthy conferred with the Board at 7:45 P.M. on various departmental matters.

Alan E. Kunian and Michael A. Picciani conferred with the Board at 8:05 P.M. regarding the possibility of changing the name of "Mary Agnes Road" to "Woodfield Road". The matter was taken under advisement, and the Board agreed to investigate the legal technicalities involved in changing the name of a private way.

Attorney Richard Higgins conferred with the Board at 8:20 P.M. regarding the case of Julia Smith vs. the Town of Framingham for injuries received from an alleged sidewalk defect.

Attorney Higgins requested a settlement in the amount of \$1,000.00.

Cornelius J. Sullivan, Town Counsel, suggested the case be settled for \$750.00.

Peter Lembo suggested a compromise in the amount of \$875.00, and it was unanimously voted.

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CONFERENCES-cont.

It was unanimously voted to authorize Mr. Sullivan to settle the case of Mrs. Bigelow vs. the Town of Framingham for injuries received from an alleged sidewalk defect in the amount of \$600.00.

Edward O'Malley conferred with the Board at 9:05 P.M. and presented a petition requesting traffic lights at the intersection of Concord St., Webster St., Everit Ave., and Dennison Ave. The matter was taken under advisement.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission:

Waverly St., approximately 50' of underground conduit from manhole #203 southerly to Cedar St.; Cedar St., approximately 208' of underground conduit from Waverly St., southerly and thence southeasterly crossing the street to joint pole 29/3. No one objected to the granting of the petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole, one hip guy and anchor (one existing JO pole to be removed): Salem End Rd., northwesterly side, approximately 350' southwest of Badger Road. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. for five pole locations (five existing poles to be removed) on Mt. Wayte Ave., northwesterly side, southwesterly from a point approximately 215' southwest of Franklin St.; two poles (two existing poles to be removed) on Mt. Wayte Ave., northwesterly side, northeasterly from a point approximately 250' northeast of Dudley Rd., was granted.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Franklin St., southwesterly side, approximately 285' southeast of Mt. Wayte Ave. (one existing JO pole to be removed), was granted.

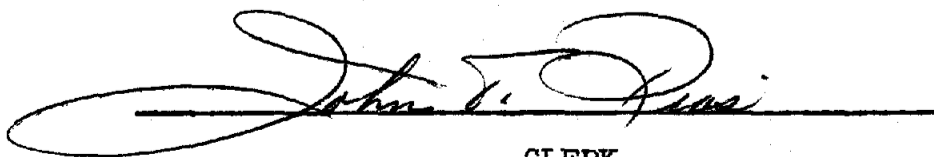
RENT OF HALLS

It was voted to grant the use of the Banquet Hall on April 12, 13, 14, 17, 18, 20, 21, 26, 27, 28, 29, 1961 for rehearsals, and Nevins Hall on April 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 1961 for rehearsals, and Nevins Hall on April 29, 1961 for "1961 Follies" performance to the Framingham Young Women's Club for a fee of \$50. a day for the performance and \$5. per day for the rehearsals, or a total of \$130.00.

It was voted to grant the use of Nevins Hall on November 16, 1960 for the purpose of decorating and setting up for a Bazaar on November 17, 1960 and the use of the Banquet Hall on November 16, 1960 for the purpose of setting up and decorating for a luncheon on the 17th of November to the Framingham Union Hospital Aid Association, for a fee of \$50.00.
