### \*CONFERENCES\*

Attorney J. Walton Tuttle conferred with the Board at 7:45 P.M. regarding the transfer of the all alcoholic beverage license from the Pine Crest House to the Abner Wheeler House, both properties owned by the F.R.G. Corporation.

Mr. Tuttle is Attorney for the Turnpike Steakhouse Inc. which holds all capital stock to the F.R.G. Corporation as security under agreement previously approved by the Board of Selectmen.

He requested that approval be withheld until such time as the matter can be straightened out.

On motion of Peter Lembo, it was unanimously voted to deny the application of the F.R.G. Corporation to transfer the all alcoholic beverage common victualer license from the Pine Crest House to the Abner Wheeler House because the applicant has not complied with the provisions of Section 15A, Chapter 138 of the General Laws, which requires that an affidavit be filed with the licensing authority indicating that the applicant has notified all abutters of the location where the license is to be exercised.

Chief Trevett conferred with the Board at 8 P.M.

On motion of John T. Dias, it was unanimously voted to award the contract to supply fire alarm cable to the Inter-City Electric Supply Corp., the low bidder, in accordance with their bid as follows:

\*HEARINGS\*


\*AUTHORIZE SETTLEMENT OF CASES\*
