REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN JULY 19, 1960

The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held at 7:30 P.M.
Present: Mr. John T. Dias, Clerk, and Mr. Peter Lembo.

LICENSES GRANTED

Licenses were granted to the following:

CONFERENCES

Attorney Joseph Levco, acting as attorney for the F.R.G. Corporation, conferred with the Board at 7:45 P.M. regarding the transfer of the liquor license from the Pine Crest House, 55 Nicholas Rd., to the Abner Wheeler House at 680 Worcester Rd.

The Board agreed to reconsider their original action in denying this transfer since the technicalities had been complied with, and to request the approval of the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission of this reconsideration.

Mr. & Mrs. Frank Peseckis, Mr. & Mrs. Cedric Libbey, and Mrs. Julia Price conferred with the Board at 8:05 P.M. regarding the possibility of restraining dogs in the Nobscot area. They suffer from large dogs in the area. There have been many unpleasant situations. They have no cooperation from the owners. They have not been able to identify any individual dogs which have caused this trouble. They requested that all dogs be restrained at all times.

The Board suggested that the individual dogs causing the trouble be reported immediately to the dog officer or to the Board. Whatever action is necessary will be taken. It is also suggested that an article be inserted in a future town meeting requiring that all dogs be restrained.

The Board agreed to have Lee Berte, Dog Officer, check the area closely.

Van M. Stevens, Jr., Dexter L. Levy, Frederick C. Hawkes, James Frieryand John Lally, residents of Donna Road, conferred with the Board at 8:45 P.M. regarding a road built by a developer running parallel to Donna Road. This road is presently unfinished, and the rain causes silt and mud running on the land owned by the complainants. They stated that a portion of the area includes a cliff of clay and mud approximately 30' high which can mean trouble in the future.

It is the feeling of the Board that this matter is basically a civil matter between the complainants and the contractor, but the Board agreed to contact the contractor to see if the construction of the road can be speeded up a little more so as to prevent further soil erosion.

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CONFERENCES-cont.

Representatives of the South Side Association conferred with the Board at 9:15 P.M. regarding surveyors working in the area of route 126, 135, Beaver St., etc. They have tried to find out the purpose of the surveying without success.

The Board agreed to write to Commissioner DiNatale, State Department of Public Works, to secure whatever information is available on the proposed projects in the area.

Precinct realignments were explained by Mr. Dias and Mr. Lembo, and were discussed with representatives of the South Side Association.

Attorney Julian Hargraves and Victor H. Galvani conferred with the Board at 10:45 P.M. regarding the possibility of a conference with the Board of Selectmen and any other interested town officials regarding assessments on Shoppers' World.

The Board agreed to meet with the representatives of Shoppers' World, Inc. at 10 A.M., July 29, 1960, and to invite the Board of Assessors, Commissioners of Public Works, Finance Committee, and Planning Board.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for two poles on Mt. Wayte Ave., northwesterly side, southwesterly from a point approximately 695' southwest of Franklin St., (these are existing poles - no new poles to be set). There were no objectors present, and the petition was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Mt. Wayte Ave., north westerly side, approximately 175' northeast of Dudley Road; one pole, guy wire and anchor on Mt. Wayte Ave., approximately 100' northeast of Dudley Rd. (four existing JO poles to be removed); one pole, hip guy and anchor on Mt. Wayte Ave., approximately 65' southwest of Franklin St., (eight existing JO poles to be removed). There were no objectors present, and the petition was granted.

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HEARINGS - cont.

A public hearing was held at 8:15 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the N.Y., N.H. & H. Railroad for a license to use the land at the rear of 30 Pearl St. for the storage of 10,000 additional gallons of diesel fuel in one tank underground. Mr. Philpott, representing the Esso Co., was present. He did not have the return receipts indicating that the abutters had been notified, and was not sure if this had been done.

The Board voted to grant the license subject to the presentation of the return receipts indicating that the abutters had been notified in accordance with the law.

No return receipts have been filed.

Co. for one pole location on Water St., northerly side, approximately 550' east of Edgell Rd., (one existing JO pole to be removed), and one pole on Water St., northerly side, approximately 570' west of Hemenway Road, (one existing JO pole to be removed), was granted.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Waverly St., northerly side, approximately 25' west of Marble St., was granted.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Fay Road, southeasterly side, approximately 445' southwest of Diaz St. (one existing JO pole to be removed), was granted.

The petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. JO Boston Edison Co. for the removal of one pole on Brook St., southeasterly side, approximately 60' southwest of Brookfield Ave., was approved. (location granted under orders dated and recorded 12/30/58 - Town Clerk's book 10, page 359).

BUILDING*

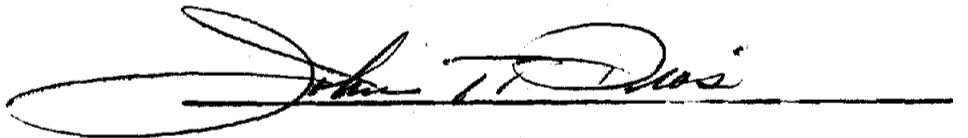
