It was voted to deny the application of Peter Vangel for a Common Victualer's All Alcoholic Beverage License because no such license is presently available.

AUTHORIZE TOWN TREASURER TO BORROW

It was voted to authorize Albert E. Cole, Town Treasurer, to borrow \$1,100,000.00 for the construction of the school to be located on the property formerly known as the Hemenway property on Water St.

REQUEST TRANSFER FROM FINANCE COMMITTEE

It was voted to request a transfer of \$150.00 from the Reserve Fund for "Salary and Wages-Memorial Building" for overtime of the custodians for the remainder of the year.

CONFERENCES

Victor H. Galvani, Esq., conferred with the Board at 7:45 P.M. regarding settlement of the land damage case of Walter L. Bostick on Water St. He stated that 1,000' were taken when the road was widened, and a 30' sewer easement had been taken since then, and that the land taken represents almost one-half of the total area. He stated that his client was willing to settle for \$500.00. The matter was taken under advisement.

Police Chief McCarthy and Patrolman Walter Mahoney conferred with the Board at 8:40 P.M. On the recommendation of Chief McCarthy, it was voted to appoint the following special policewomen:

Chief McCarthy and Patrolman Mahoney discussed the school bus transportation problems and school traffic posts. One of the new policewomen will be stationed at Elm St. and Potter Rd., and the crossing at Edgell Road and Edgebrook Road will be covered.

Chief McCarthy had investigated the complaint about traffic on Hardy St. and recommends that trucks weighing more than two and a half tons be excluded from Hardy St., and stop signs be placed at either end.

The Board unanimously voted to adopt Chief McCarthy's recommendations.

REALIGNMENT OF PRECINCTS

On motion of Richard D. Mahoney, it was unanimously voted to accept the so-called Johnson plan for realignment of the precincts subject to any minor modifications by the Town Clerk necessary to maintain the equality of the precincts without changing the general plan of realignment.

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HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of Jewett W. Hulbert that he be given a special permit, pursuant to Section XVI of the Building By-Law as amended, to construct a permanent tower 90' high off Brimstone Lane, on Nobscot Hill. Attorney Edward G. Fischer, representing Mr. Hulbert, stated that the tower was to provide for efficient control of traffic for fleets of trucks operating in the area. The users of the tower would rent space thereon similar to towers under operation by the American Tel. & Tel. Co. and Raytheon. He stated that he had anticipated no trouble in securing the necessary clearance from the FAC - CAB - and Mass. Bureau of Aeronautics. There was no objection to the granting of this petition, and it was unanimously voted to authorize the Building Inspector to issue a permit for the construction of this tower provided that the applicant secures the necessary clearance from all pertinent agencies.

A public hearing was held at 8:05 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission: Edgell Rd., approximately 45' of underground conduit from existing conduit northeasterly to joint pole 74/35. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the petition.

A public hearing was held at 8:05 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, for the following permission: Tel. Co. - Pleasant St., southerly side, from a point approximately 133' northeast of the Southborough-Framingham Town Line, two poles; (one existing Tel. pole to be removed); Pleasant St., southerly side, from a point approximately 634' northeast of the Southborough-Framingham Town Line, two poles, (one existing Tel. pole to be removed); Pleasant St., southerly side, from a point approximately 1126' northeast of the Southborough-Framingham Town Line, two poles (one existing Tel. pole to be removed). No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the petition.

A public hearing was held at 8:05 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission: Edgell Rd., approximately 100' of underground conduit from JO pole 74/53, north and thence for approximately 32' west to proposed manhole #642, and thence for approximately 5,396' north to existing conduit, including proposed manholes #642 to 648 inclusive; Edgebrook Rd., approximately 60' of underground conduit from Joint pole 340/1, north to proposed conduit on Brook St.; Brook St., approximately 60' of underground conduit from proposed conduit on Edgebrook Road, north and thence westerly to proposed conduit on Edgell Rd.; Brook St., approximately 225' of underground

conduit from proposed conduit on Edgell Road, easterly to joint pole #71; Edgell Rd., approximately 10' of underground conduit from proposed manhole #643, southwesterly to Pine Lane; Pine Lane, approximately 45' of underground conduit from Edgell Rd., west to Joint pole 250/1; Edgell Rd., approximately 50' of underground conduit from proposed manhole #644, southeasterly to Scott Drive; Scott Drive, approximately 25' of underground conduit from Edgell Rd., southeasterly to Joint pole 680/1; Edgell Rd., approximately 189' of underground conduit from proposed manhole #646, south and thence southwesterly to Lyman Road, Lyman Road, approximately 174' of underground conduit from Edgell Road, west to Joint Pole 74-82/1; Edgell Road, approximately 276' of underground conduit from proposed manhole #646, north to a dead end; Edgell Rd., approximately 257' of underground conduit from proposed manhole #646, north and thence east to a dead end at the corner of Frost St. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the petition.

APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS

Joseph F. Sliney and Ernest E. Weldon were appointed Special Police Officers for a term of one year.

PETITIONS

The petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. JO Boston Edison Co. for the removal of one pole on Edgell Rd., easterly side, approximately 315' north of Water St., granted under orders dated and recorded 7/31/45 - Town Clerk's book 8, page 988, was approved.

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Waverly St., southerly side, approximately 280' east of Marble St., (one existing JO pole to be removed), was granted.


MEMORIAL BUILDING
