At 8 P.M. Richard Day, Ted Goodwin, and John Tata, representing the Chamber of Commerce, conferred with the Board concerning the parking problems in the down-town section of the town. They feel that they would like to continue the present system of free parking on Friday evenings, and Saturdays until November 1, and then possibly resume the full use of meters. The problems involving the regulations of parking in the down-town business area, off street parking, and the enforcement of parking regulations were discussed and it was decided that the regulations would be enforced more rigorously, and that second offenders would be required to see a ranking police officer, and would be informed that further violations would be referred to the District Court.

\*USE OF ATHENAEUM HALL\*

It was voted to grant permission to St. George's Parish to use Athenaeum Hall for Sunday school purposes on Saturday mornings until their new hall is completed. The rental fee of \$30.00 per month, plus \$5.00 per day for custodian services was established.

\*USE OF OLD ARMORY\*

It was voted to allow the Post Office the use of the old Armory building during the Christmas mailing season. The rental fee of \$75.00 for the month of December was established with the understanding that the Post Office Department pay all costs of operating the building.

The following were appointed sworn weighers for a term of one year:


