CONFERENCES

Sgt. Morreale of the Army Recruiting Office conferred with the Board at 7:30 P.M. and requested permission to place a 53' trailer on Union Ave., November 2 and 3, 1960. The trailer will contain a missile to be exhibited in connection with the Army Recruiting program. It was also suggested that the area in front of the Memorial Building could be used for this purpose. The matter was taken under advisement.

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 7:45 P.M. on various departmental matters.

Mrs. Mulhern, Mrs. Donald Baker, and Mrs. James Burke conferred with the Board at 8:45 P.M. regarding traffic on Elm St. They suggested that all traffic be restricted over Elm St. during the hours of 8:15 to 9 am. and from 2:30 to 3:15 P.M. until such time as sidewalks are installed or additional buses are provided.

Mr. Dias suggested that this would create a hardship in the area, and that it was more practical to make Elm St. one way north from McGrath Sq. to Potter Rd. during these hours.

It was unanimously voted to make Elm St. one way north from McGrath Sq. to Potter Rd. during the hours of 8:15 to 9 a.m. and 2:30 to 3:15 p.m. This regulation will be of a temporary nature.

Representatives of the South Side Association conferred with the Board at 9:15 P.M. regarding realignment of the precincts. There was a general discussion of the problem involved in the realignment and the reasons for the plan adopted by the Board.

BUILDING INSPECTOR

It was voted to authorize the Building Inspector to waive the fee for the building permit for the new Methodist Church in Saxonville to be constructed at the corner of Brook and Water Streets.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Worcester Road, northerly side, approximately 350' east of California Ave. (this is an existing pole - no new pole to be set). No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. No one was present objecting to the granting of the petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Water St., north-easterly side, opposite Brook St. No one was present objecting to the granting of the petition, and the same was granted.

PETITION


The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location on Freeman St., easterly side, approximately 215' north of Howard St. (one existing JO pole to be removed), on which a public hearing was held on October 11, was discussed. The Engineer discussed the matter with Joseph D'Agata and Ruth M. Collins and they are both agreeable to a change of location which would move the pole 20' southerly to line up with the northerly side of the D' Agata home. The Engineering Department recommended that the petition be approved under these conditions, and the Board voted to grant said petition.

EXTRA HOUR

It was voted to grant Armand's Beacon Terrace permission to remain open until 1 a.m. on every night except Saturday during the month of November and December, 1960. An additional fee of \$70.00 will be charged for this additional time.
