LIQUOR ESTABLISHMENTS - ELECTION DAY

On motion of Peter Lembo, it was unanimously voted that all liquor establishments be closed between the hours of 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 1960.

CONFERENCES

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 7:30 P.M. on various departmental matters.

He was instructed to start one way traffic on Elm St. between the hours of 8 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. and 2:15 p.m. to 3 p.m. Traffic is to proceed northerly on Elm St. between McGrath Square and Potter Road.

The Chief was also instructed to place signs in school areas indicating school zones and a traffic speed limit of 20 m.p.h.

The matter of traffic conditions on Waverly St. near the Union House was discussed, and the Chief was instructed to investigate the matter and report to this Board.

Donald Johnson, Elbert Tuttle, Esq., Mrs. Cote, Herbert Marsland, William McMaus, and Raymond Smith conferred with the Board at 8:45 P.M. regarding voting problems in precincts 1 and 2.

Mr. Johnson noted that the increase in registered voters in precincts 1 and 2 will cause problems between the hours of 5 and 8 p.m. since most people prefer to vote during these hours. He suggested that a public relations campaign urging people to vote before 5 o'clock P.M.

There was a general discussion of the procedures to be followed when the polls close at 8 p.m. to insure that all those in line at that time are allowed to vote.

The problems of police protection at the polls and parking and traffic control were discussed at length.

APPOINTMENT

Raymond Harrison was appointed a sworn weigher for a term of one year.

BURGLAR ALARM SYSTEM

It was voted to grant permission to the Hyde Park Alarm System, Inc. to install a burglar alarm system from the Sea 'n Surf at 303 Worcester Road to the Framingham Police Department. All costs of this installation are to be borne by the Sea 'n Surf restaurant.
