The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held at 7:30 P.M.

\*LICENSES GRANTED\*

Licenses were granted to the following:

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### \*BIDS-SUPPLYING FIRE ALARM COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT\*

A sealed bid for supplying fire alarm communication equipment was publicly opened and read at 8 P.M., and was received from the Gamewell Co. in the amount of \$6516.00. This was the only bid received and will be studied by Chief Trevett. The matter was taken under advisement pending his report.

### \*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 8:05 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission: Elm St., approximately 50' of underground conduit from proposed joint pole 511/3, southeasterly to existing conduit. (approximately 50' of existing underground conduit to be abandoned). No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the same.

A public hearing was held at 8:15 p.m., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Trinity Oil, Inc. for a license to use the land at 133-143 Leland St. for the storage of 15,000 gallons of Trichlorethylene in one aboveground tank.

Frank Gardner presented return receipts indicating abutters had been notified.

Mr. Rears, representing the Dupont Co., and Mr. Grunlage, representing the Blakeslee Co., appeared with Mr. Gardner. They explained that they have permission to store more petroleum products than are actually stored on the premises at this time, and would like to use an available tank for the storage of Trichlorethylene. Mr. Rears explained that this material is used for de-greasing operation in industrial plants. The storage of the material is rigidly controlled by state laws. The odor slightly resembles that of chloroform. He presented a letter from the Factory Mutual Testing Laboratories indicating the material was not inflammable, and agreed to supply medical and chemical data regarding the material.

Andre J. Cournoyer, 155 Leland St., and Catherine Tamuleviz, 166 Leland St., objected to the granting of this permit. Mr. Cournoyer stated he works with this material at General Motors and there are signs indicating the material is dangerous and should not be inhaled. He felt that this could be dangerous and could result in devaluation of his property. Mrs. Tamuleviz felt that the material would be an additional hazard to the children in the area.

The matter was taken under advisement.


