REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN NOVEMBER 29, 1960

The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held at 7:30 P.M.
Present: Mr. Richard D. Mahoney, Chairman, and Mr. Peter Lembo.

LICENSES GRANTED

Licenses were granted as follows:

Amusement license - Natick Lodge #2076, B'Nai B'Rith, bazaar (booths, games, dancing, etc.), Armory, Concord St., December 10.

PERMISSION TO MOVE BUILDING

A permit was granted to the Eastleigh Farms to move a building from south side of Edmands Road to north side of Edmands Road (600 yds. west of present location), November 30 to December 2, 1960.

RATIFICATIONS

Action taken informally in granting permits was ratified:

Obstruct sidewalk - Ned Nobilini & Son, 8-24 Union Ave., applying bird repellent, November 28 to December 8.

Open, occupy and obstruct st. - New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co., between pole #69-70 Central St., placing load coil in existing cable, November 28, to December 28.

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CONFERENCE

Chief Trevett and Building Inspector Francis J. Smith conferred with the Board at 7:45 P.M. regarding variances of the building by-laws. They were instructed to investigate all requests for such variances in the future.

HEARINGS

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission:

Proctor St., approximately 68' of underground conduit from proposed joint pole #6, easterly to existing conduit. Thomas L. Barron appeared and stated he had no objection to the granting of the petition, but requested that no work be done between December 10 and December 25, 1960 since this is his busy season. The Board voted to instruct the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. that no work shall be done during this period.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for the following permission: Barber Road, westerly side, from a pole located approximately 575' north of Memorial Street, one hip guy and anchor. Austin Henschel appeared and had no objection to the location of the hip guy and anchor. It was voted to grant the petition.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole location (one existing JO pole to be removed) on Everit Ave., northeasterly side, approximately 245' southeast of Concord St. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the same.

A hearing was held at 8:30 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, regarding a complaint about a dog owned by Harold P. Gardner, 51 Riverview Road, Framingham. H. Tober, complainant, and Mr. & Mrs. Gardner appeared. Mr. Tober stated that the dog was not vicious, but had created a nuisance on his property. A general discussion of the problem followed, and Mr. Tober was informed by the Board that there was no evidence warranting any action by the Board to restrain the dog.

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CAROUSEL THEATRE

It was voted to write to the Carousel Theatre to secure information regarding unused tickets for the performance "South Pacific" which was cancelled because of the hurricane of 1960.

PETITION

The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for two pole locations on Clifford St., southerly side, easterly from a point approximately 135' east of Bridges St. (two existing JO poles to be removed) was granted.

TRANSFER SHARES OF STOCK GRANTED



It was voted to grant Milton Bordwin a variance of the building by-laws permitting a side yard of 6.8 feet on the property identified as #222 Fountain Street.
