CONFERENCES-cont.

John Murtagh, Veterans' Agent, and Joseph Champney, President of the Veterans' Council, conferred with the Board at 9:45 P.M. regarding celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Civil War.

The Board requested that they submit a list of ten citizens of whom five will be appointed as a Committee to investigate the possibility of having such a celebration. The Committee will also consist of the Veterans' Agent and the Commanders of the Veterans' organizations.

Chief McCarthy conferred with the Board at 10:15 P.M. on various departmental matters.

Robert McNally, representing the Committee studying the problem of commuter service and transportation, conferred with the Board at 11 P.M. He explained that a non-profit council had been incorporated to study the problem consisting of representatives of Boston, Newton, Wellesley, Natick, and Framingham. The council is submitting legislation recommending the creation of a transit district which could lease, operate and maintain transit service in the area west of Boston. The district could require financial assistance from the cities and towns served for capital expenditure only. Operating costs must be borne by revenue. If the operating costs exceed the revenue the representatives of the municipalities involved could either dissolve the district and dispose of the assets, or if the municipalities so voted could raise sufficient funds to continue operation by the contributions from the municipalities.

HEARING


