APPOINTMENT

Frank M. Nicoloro was appointed a special police officer for a term of one year.

PETITIONS

Petitions of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for pole locations were granted as follows:

Buckminster St., northwesterly side, southwesterly from a point approximately 60' southwest of Walnut St., two poles, (two existing JO poles to be removed).

Concord St., southeasterly side approximately 1,005' northeast of Old Conn. Path, one pole (one existing JO pole to be removed).

Victory St., southeasterly side, southwesterly from a point approximately 20' southwest of Wilson Ave., three poles, guy wire and anchor on the third pole.

Fountain St., northerly side, approximately 215' west of Winter St., one pole (one existing JO pole to be removed).

MEMORIAL BUILDING CLOSED

It was voted to close the Memorial Building at 12 noon on Friday, December 23 1960.

REQUEST TRANSFER

It was voted to request a transfer of \$2167.38 from the Reserve Fund to the Group Insurance account.

HEARING

At 8:15 P.M. a public hearing was held in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of Shopper's World, Inc. for a license to use the land at 1 Worcester Rd. for a six car garage and repair shop, tire sales and service, storage of 20 cases of anti freeze in case lots aboveground (6 gals. per case), 1-54 gal. drum of brake fluid, aboveground, and 1-54 gal. drum of alcohol, aboveground.

Attorney Victor H. Galvani returned the receipt cards indicating that the abutters had been notified. Mr. Galvani and Mr. George Shrigley outlined in detail the use of the proposed garage. There was no opposition and the license was granted.

CONFERENCES

At 7:45 Chief Trevett conferred with the Board concerning budget requests for 1961. It was unanimously voted to approve his report as submitted.

At 8:50 Richard B. Dew conferred with the Board regarding the traffic problems on Winter St. during the hours when children are going to and from school. Walter B. Mahoney, Safety Officer, was present. Mr. Dew presented a petition containing approximately fifty-two signatures, requesting that highway laws be adequately enforced. He also presented a report of a traffic survey taken by the Registry of Motor Vehicles, indicating that the average speed between 8 and 8:45 A.M., and from 2:15 to 3 P.M. was 35 M.P.H. Mr. Dew recommended that Winter St. be made one way, south, from 8 to 8:45 A.M. and one way, north, from 2:15 to 3 P.M., that policemen escort the children from Ardmore Rd., along Winter St., across Fountain and Waverly Sts., that speed limits be posted; and that speed limits be enforced until there are no violations. He also suggested that the Board of Public Works push the snow back off the street as far as possible. Walter Mahoney informed the Board that a policewoman meets this group of school children at Ransom Road and directs them along Fountain Street and Waverly Street. The matter was taken under advisement and the Board agreed to confer with Chief McCarthy at the next regular meeting.

At 9:40 P.M. Esau Verge, Donald Lavalley, Arthur Bowes, and Raymond A. Smith, members of the Transportation Committee appointed under article 26, of a special town meeting held October 26, 1960 conferred with the Board regarding the steps taken by the Board, to solve the safety problems that arise during the periods when the children are going to and from school. Mr. Mahoney explained what has been done in the Winter Street and Elm Street areas and there was a general discussion of the use of policewomen directing school traffic and the problems of police protection and school transportation.

Mr. Verge stated that the intersection of Buckminster Square and Union Ave., and the intersection of Lake St. and Old Conn. Path had been suggested as the most dangerous areas remaining in town. The Board agreed to study the possibility of establishing posts for special policewomen at these locations.

SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

It was noted that no Alcoholic Beverages could be sold after 12 midnight on the evening of Dec. 31, 1960, but that patrons would be allowed to remain on the premises until 1 a.m.

It was voted that the hours for the sale of alcoholic beverages on January 1, 1961 would be extended until 1 a.m. and that patrons would be allowed to remain on the premises until 2 a.m.

BOARD MEETING


It was voted that there will be no regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen on the evening of December 27, 1960.
