\*BIDS REJECTED FOR FURNISHING #5 FUEL OIL FOR POLICE STATION\*

It was unanimously voted to reject all bids for furnishing #5 fuel oil  
for the Police Station, and to instruct the Police Department to secure this  
fuel oil from Mystic Bituminous Products under the School Dept. contract.

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\*CONTRACT FOR COAL FOR MEMORIAL BUILDING\*

It was unanimously voted to award the contract for furnishing Pocahantas Pea Coal for the Memorial Building to the Framingham Coal & Oil Co., Inc. at a price of \$19.95 per ton less 2% discount.

\*LEAVE OF ABSENCE\*

It was unanimously voted to grant a leave of absence to Patrolman Harold A. LeDoux, Jr. from February 9, 1964 through May 2, 1964.

\*CONFERENCE\*

A conference was held at 8:10 P.M. on the proposed taxicab by-law sponsored by Attorney Curtis Dooling on behalf of his client, John Thompson of Tommy's Taxi, Inc.

Present were Attorney Dooling, John Thompson of Tommy's Taxi, Inc., 411 Waverly Street, speaking in favor of the article.

Attorney Greenwald, representing Al's Independent Taxi, Inc., 1 Columbia St., Attorney John St. Andre, representing Smitty's Cab, 30 Sanger St., and also Centre Cab Co., 2 Library St., and Central Cab, 5 Pershing Ave., Attorney Dewey C. Kadra represented Central Taxi and Attorney Wolper represented Saxonville Cab, opposed the inclusion of this article in the Warrant for the Special Town Meeting. It was their feeling that the adoption of this by-law would tend to create a monopoly favoring Tommy's Cab and they also felt that this imposed restrictions beyond the scope of the enabling legislation.

The matter was discussed at considerable length.

Following the conference it was unanimously voted not to include the article in the Warrant for the Special Town Meeting, and to appoint the following committee to study the matter:

1. John Thompson, representing Tommy's Taxi, Inc., 411 Waverly St.
2. Gordon Vandenburg, representing Al's Independent Taxi, Inc.,  
1 Columbia St.
3. Delmar Lindsay, representing Centre Cab Co., 2 Library St.

Police Chief Arthur F. Martins, or a police officer delegated by him, and Attorney Joseph H. Lewis will serve as Adviser to this Committee.

\*APPOINTMENT\*

Leonard C. Waugh was appointed a special police officer for a term of one year.

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\*PETITIONS\*


