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LIQUOR VIOLATION

It was unanimously voted that the Framingham Post #929 Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Inc. were guilty of a violation of Chapter 138 of the General Laws, namely, sale and service of alcoholic beverages to a minor on December 21, 1963. It was voted to reprimand them and to suspend their license for seven days, but to waive this suspension because the establishment was closed from January 1, 1964 to February 17, 1964. It was also voted to warn them that any further violations of Chapter 138 may result in the permanent revocation of their license.

It was voted to grant, subject to the approval of the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission, change in manager of the Framingham Post #929, Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Inc., 74-76 Pearl St., for the sale of alcoholic beverages as a club, from William D. Kerr, present manager, to Ralph L. Brown, new manager.

3. On First St. at Taralli Terrace for traffic eastbound and westbound.
4. On Morton St. at Taralli Terrace for traffic east and westbound.
5. On Blandin Ave. at Irving St. for traffic southbound.
6. On Wausakum St. at Hollis St. for northbound traffic.
7. On Dudley Road at Fountain St. for traffic southbound.
8. On Mount Wayte Ave. at Union Ave. for traffic eastbound.
9. On Wickford Road at Central St. for southbound traffic.
10. On Hamilton St. at Old Conn. Path for southbound traffic.

1. On Park Place from Park St. to Parking Lot both sides.
