\*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole (one existing JO pole to be removed), on Waveney Rd., northeasterly side, at Lanewood Avenue. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.
