A public hearing was held at 8 o'clock P.M., in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one hip guy and anchor on Union Ave., from a pole located on westerly side, approximately 65' south of River St. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and it was voted to grant the same.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for three poles (four existing JO poles to be removed) on Speen St., northeasterly side, northwesterly from a point approximately 92' northwest of Cochituate Road. No one was present objecting to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for one hip guy and anchor on Main St., from a pole located on northerly side, approximately 162' east of Walnut St. There was no objection to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8:15 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Room 21, Memorial Building, on the application of the Granet Corp. and/or W. W. Clay and C. F. POLICE DEPARTMENT

It was voted to approve the following recommendations concerning the traffic problem on Spring Lane and Pamela Road:

3. The Board suggests that the Police Department confer with the representatives of the Temple regarding advance notice of special functions.

4. This Board has no authority to pave the street approaching the Temple, and suggests that this matter be discussed with the Board of Public Works.

TOWN COUNSEL


It was voted to authorize the Town Counsel to settle the claim of Lillian Chapman vs. Town of Framingham in the amount of \$400.00.
