\*TRANSFER OF LIQUOR LICENSE\*

It was voted to grant, subject to the approval of the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission, transfer of the All Alcoholic Beverages Restaurant license from Northeast Motel Operation, Inc., 30 Worcester Rd, to Southern Lounge of Framingham, Inc., for the sale of all alcoholic beverages as a restaurant, at 30 Worcester Rd.

\*HEARINGS\*

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, Rm. 21, Memorial Building., on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New England Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole on Marian Rd., southeasterly side, approximately 460 ft. northeast of Beaver St., (one existing JO pole to be removed) and one pole pole on Marian Rd., (two existing JO poles to be removed). There was no objection to the granting of this petition and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New England Tel. & Tel. Co. for two poles on Speen St., southerly side, easterly from a point approximately 1020 ft. east of Old Conn. Path, guy wire and anchor on each pole. These are existing poles and guys, no new poles to be set. There was no objection to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

A public hearing was held at 8 P.M. in the Selectmen's Office, room 21, Memorial Building, on the petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New England Tel. & Tel. Co. for one pole, hip guy and anchor on Hallett Rd., easterly side, approximately 38 ft. north of Central St., (one existing JO pole to be removed). There was no objection to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.

Co. for approximately 1157 ft. of buried cable on Temple St. and Worcester Rd., from pole 246/27, approximately 56 ft. south of Worcester Rd. to and extending along Worcester Rd. to property line. There was no objection to the granting of this petition, and the same was granted.
