HEARING

TOWN COUNSEL

It was unanimously voted to authorize the Town Counsel to settle the claim of Mrs. Dorothy Nicholas for damages resulting from an alleged sidewalk defect in the amount of \$300.00.

CONFERENCE

Anthony DelMonte and Charles Perkins conferred with the Board at 8:15 P.M. regarding the water condition in Mr. DelMonte's cellar. Mr. DelMonte requested that the Building Inspector furnish him with a written report on this matter, and that he take whatever action is necessary to require the builder to remedy the situation. The matter was taken under consideration, and the Board agreed to notify Mr. DelMonte of its decision.

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BUILDING INSPECTOR

It was unanimously voted to authorize the Building Inspector to issue a permit to William E. Clark, 655 Water Street, to enable him to construct a garage on the above mentioned property with a side yard of 4'.

PETITIONS

The petition of the New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. JO Boston Edison Co. for the removal of one pole on Old Connecticut Path, southeasterly side, approximately 260' northeast of Speen St., location granted under orders dated and recorded January 4, 1963, Town Clerk's Book 12, page 102, was approved.


The petition of the Boston Edison Co. JO New Eng. Tel. & Tel. Co. for six poles, guy wire and anchor on first pole (six JO existing poles to be removed) on Cochituate Road, southerly side, easterly from a point approximately 123' east of Whittier St., and one pole (one existing JO pole to be removed) on Cochituate Road, northerly side, approximately 98' west of Whittier St., was granted.

APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

The application of Marie T. Higgins, Framingham, and others (not residents of Framingham, filed with the Secretary of State an application for a certificate of incorporation under the name of the "Perceptual Ability Center, Inc." to be located in the Town of Sherborn. The Secretary of State was notified that the application was approved as far as the Framingham resident is concerned.
