A request was received from Nancy Swidler, a Town Meeting member, for an Article in the next Town Meeting to extend the underground street lighting in the Swanson Rd., Horrigan Drive area. The Board agreed to include such an Article in the next special Town Meeting, provided a favorable report was received from the Engineering Department.

RESIGNATION - HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION

A letter of resignation was received from Peter E. Clark as a member of the Human Relations Commission. Included with it was a letter of appreciation from the other members of the Human Relations Commission. The Board accepted the resignation with regret and voted to send him a letter of thanks for the services volunteered to the community.

LETTER FROM WOODROW WILSON PARENT TEACHERS' ORGANIZATION RE: GENERAL CHEMICAL CORPORATION

The operation of the General Chemical Corporation on Leland Street was questioned by the Parent Teachers' Organization because it appeared to pose a very great danger to the children of the adjacent school. It was agreed that an investigation would be made and a general public hearing would be held on November 16, 1981 during the regular Selectmen's meeting on this subject.

REQUEST FOR DESIGNATION OF PROPOSED ROAD BY FRAMINGHAM HOUSING AUTHORITY

The Framingham Housing Authority requested that a new road to be constructed in conjunction with a new elderly housing project be named John J. Brady Drive. The Board agreed to make such a designation provided the proper procedures could be set up. It was also requested that this road be included in the roads to be accepted as public ways in the Annual Town Meeting. The proper steps will be taken in that regard, provided all of the construction can be completed to meet Town requirements.

A discussion of proposed 1982 liquor license fees was initiated by Selectman Lavin. After making a verbal presentation, it was agreed that a tabulation would be made for inclusion in the next Selectmen's meeting at which time a vote would be taken.


Two applications for appointment as the representative of the Board of Selectmen on the SMOC Board of Directors were reviewed and it was requested that the administrator interview each of the applicants as the basis of a recommendation.

Dr. Dennis Golden of Framingham State College appeared to thank the Board for their consideration in hearing both sides of the controversy over the issuance of the one-day license for student activities at the College Forum. He congratulated the Board on being business-like and fair in their evaluation and pledged to maintain proper control to prevent any problems on future licenses.

The Board noted receipt of an outline of the Floodplain Management Regulations prepared by the Planning Department.

Letters of commendation concerning the work of the Engineering Department and Lt. Nardini of the Police Department in support of an investigation of a murder were received from an Assistant District Attorney. It was requested that these letters be included in the Personnel File of the individuals involved.
