APPOINTMENTS:

Special Police Officer - Jon P. Lawrence, 1 Scott Drive, Framingham, for a term of duration as Police Dispatcher, Framingham.

It was originally scheduled to have the Executive Session concerning collective bargaining between the Board of Library Trustees and the Board of Selectmen. However, an oversight in notifying the Board of Library Trustees officially that the agreement made with two of their representatives had occurred prevented the session from taking place. As a result, the meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M.

TRANSFER OF TOWN LAND

The Board of Selectmen met with the Conservation Administrator, Philip Tuck to sign a deed in accordance with Article 60 of the Town Meeting of 1979. Mr. Tuck explained that this was the final step in an exchange of properties between Mr. Victor Wing-Hon Lee and Maisie Tam Lee and the Town of Framingham of property in proximity of 10 Mohawk Drive. After determining that all of the legal details were in order, the Board of Selectmen unanimously voted to, and did sign the Quitclaim deed.

The Board of Selectmen reviewed a letter from Mrs. Betty McGrath, Personnel Assistant, concerning the inclusion on the warrant of a question allowing the Town to continue retirement funding to widows and widowers of retired and deceased members of the Town retirement system. A list of those eligible was submitted by Mrs. McGrath and a survey of comparable towns and their actions in this regard was also included. The Board's consensus was that they were in favor of placing this on the ballot provided the total listing was determined to be accurate and complete. A formal vote in that regard will be considered in the March 1, 1982 Selectmen's meeting after it has been checked out.

The Board noted receipt on the following correspondence:

1. Announcement of a meeting with the First National Bank of Boston to be held at the Department of Public Works office on February 23, 1982.
2. A letter from Representative Barbara Gray in support of granting a permanent liquor license to Framingham State College Pub.
3. Fire Department Overtime Report.
4. A letter from Town Counsel listing a complaint against the Zoning Board of Appeals re: Nancy Flynn and Jack Flynn, et al
5. A letter from A. Rodenhiser concerning the appointment of a School Superintendent.
6. A notice that suit was being brought against the Town by Masspirg for a restraining order to allow them to conduct canvassing after dark.

In response to a request from John King, the Executive Administrator commented that the new parking tickets and procedures of the new parking law should be available in the next 4 - 6 weeks. It hinges on the awarding of the contract for processing as well as availability of new revised tickets.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 P.M. by unanimous vote.
