HEARING - WINE AND MALT BEVERAGE RESTAURANT LICENSE APPLICATION

Attorney Victor Galvani appeared on behalf of Mr. Kostas Garefalakis in an application for a Wine and Malt Beverage Pouring License in conjunction with a restaurant operation at 147 Cochituate Road. Mr. Galvani pointed out that his client had operated the Dairy Queen on Union Avenue for fourteen years and prior to that, operated a restaurant directly across from the Police Department on Union Avenue. He stated that he was taking over a location which had a Wine & Malt Beverage Pouring License in connection with a delicatessen restaurant. The prior owner had allowed the license to expire at the end of 1985 because he was not going to continue the business. After a brief discussion, the Board voted 2-0 to award the license as requested.

SAFETY OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

The Safety Officer recommended that a posting be made on Library and Oak Streets as follows:

TWO HOUR PARKING - 5:00 P.M. to 9:00 A.M. - No restriction from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

The Board voted 2-0 to approve the parking regulations on these two streets as recommended by the Safety Officer.

REQUEST FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The Board reviewed a request from Patrolman William A. Carey of the Framingham Police Department for an unpaid leave of absence starting in June of 1986. The Board voted 2-0 to approve this leave of absence as requested.

The Board noted receipt of the following items:

1. Letter from the President of the Boston Athletic Association concerning possible contribution to sports programs locally in connection with the running of the BAA Marathon in April.
2. Notification of the MetroWest Growth Management Committee meeting on February 26, 1986.

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REQUEST FOR SPECIAL ALL ALCOHOLIC LICENSES

The Board reviewed a request from Framingham State College for four All Alcoholic Beverage licenses on a one day basis. The first was for a Senior Class Party on March 1, 1986. The Board voted unanimously not to grant the special license, stating that the possible exposure to liability of the Town prevented them from doing so. Three other functions which appeared to be for private party leases by the College, scheduled for March 18, March 22 and April 14 were taken under advisement with the recommendation that a representative of the college appear to explain the requirement and the proposed use before any action would be taken.

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

The Presidents of the Police Association and the Firefighters' Union, appeared to express their concern on the slow process of contract negotiations. The Board assured them that all steps possible were being taken by the representatives of the Town and stated that they expected to have an update from the Town Labor Counsel in an Executive Session.

The Board voted unanimously to enter an Executive Session for a discussion of collective bargaining procedures. It was a 2-0 vote and the Executive Session started at approximately 8:00 P.M. At the close of the Executive Session, at approximately 9:30 P.M., the meeting was adjourned.
