HEARING - NEW ENGLAND TELEPHONE & TELEGRAPH COMPANY & BOSTON EDISON COMPANY PETITIONS

As usual, Selectman King did not participate in the hearings. New England Telephone Company was represented by Mr. Joseph Bausk and Boston Edison Company was represented by Steven Kane. The New England Telephone Company petitioned for the addition of a guy wire and anchor on a pole on Hemenway Road to prevent damage from the weight of lines which are carried on the pole. The Boston Edison Company petitioned for installation of approximately 8 feet of conduit on Carter Drive for the purpose of establishing domestic service to a home. Hearing no objection to either of the petitions, the Board voted 2-0 to approve them.

HEARING - ALLEGED LIQUOR LICENSE VIOLATION - VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS - 74 PEARL STREET

The Board held a hearing concerning the alleged sale of alcoholic beverages to minors during the conduct of a private party at this location. Chief Brent Larrabee and Patrolman Blaise Tersoni of the Framingham Police Department presented a report which indicated the incident occurred on December 26, 1987. The patrolmen had been called to the club because of noisy disturbances. Upon entering the club, it was found that several underage people had been served alcoholic beverages, including one who was found to be only 17 years of age.

The licenseholder was represented by Mr. Orrie Tucker, the manager of record and Mr. Ron Barber, the bartender in the establishment at the time of the incident. After the facts in the case had been established, the Board took the matter under advisement.

SAFETY OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

The Board reviewed a recommendation of the Safety Officer for the installation of a No Parking sign on Wellington Avenue beside #52 Alexander Street. It was indicated that the sign could not be installed until the weather permitted. The Board voted unanimously to accept the Safety Officer's recommendation and authorized the installation of the sign.

LIQUOR VIOLATION REPORT

The Board reviewed a report submitted by Police Chief Larrabee concerning a violation of the license requirements at the Red Star Lunch at 486 Concord Street. It was unanimously agreed to set up a public hearing concerning the alleged violation.

The Board noted receipt of the following items:

FIRE DEPARTMENT GRIEVANCE

The Board briefly reviewed a grievance request for a second step review from the Fire Department. It was agreed that the hearing on the grievance would be established for the next meeting on February 8, 1988.

REQUEST FOR CHANGE IN DESCRIPTION - TIMOTHY'S SPIRITS COMPANY, INC.

Selectman Ernst moved that the application for a change in description to include a free-standing reconstructed antique diner in connection with the operation of Timothy's Spirits Company, Inc. at 123 Gates Street be removed from the table. It was voted unanimously to remove the item from the table and upon the motion of Selectman Ernst, the Board voted unanimously to approve the change in description to include the additional structure on the premises.

At the conclusion of the business for the evening, the Board voted unanimously to enter an Executive Session at approximately 8:05 P.M. for the purpose of discussing details of the collective bargaining grievance submitted from the Fire Department and collective bargaining procedures. The regular meeting was adjourned at the beginning of the Executive Session and no further business was conducted. The Executive Session was adjourned at approximately 8:45 P.M.
